Ground broken for two schools in Redmond Ridge

On June 7, Lake Washington School District celebrated milestones in two construction projects: consecutive groundbreakings for a new elementary school in Redmond Ridge East and a new middle school in Redmond Ridge. The first ceremony took place at the elementary school, and the middle school event followed half an hour later.

Families from the community attended both events along with LWSD Board member Mark Stuart and King County Councilmember Kathy Lambert. Kim Bilanko, planning principal for the new elementary school in Redmond Ridge East, spoke at that groundbreaking. (The planning principal for the middle school will be named next year.)

The current portables at Explorer are being replaced by modular classrooms that will provide a better learning environment for students and long-term energy reduction and savings.

Coming this August - Change your contact/emergency information online!

Are you tired of filling out your contact information on the emergency form every year? Wouldn't it be nice to just review the information and submit changes online, at your convenience? This August, you will get your chance to do just that. You will be able to log in to Parent Access, click on Family Access, and verify your contact/emergency information, make any needed changes, then click submit

and be done. More information on the Online Student Information Verification process will be posted on the district website in July.

If you don't have a Parent Access account, now would be a good time to set one up. Just go to the Parent Access page on the district website for more information. Then you will be ready in August to take care of your emergency information online.

Reminder: Due to required annual maintenance, some systems will be unavailable during the summer

Limited access to Skyward Family Access will be available from June 30 to September 4. For Summer School students, grades and attendance information in Skyward Family Access and access to PowerSchool Learning will generally be available through August 3. PowerSchool Learning will be unavailable for all students and parents from August 4 to September 4.

Reminder: School start time survey open

The College and Career Readiness Task force is asking K-12 staff, parents, and high school students for their opinion on four start/dismissal time options currently under consideration. Any changes to high school start and dismissal times will require changes to elementary and middle school start and end times as well. (No changes will be made for next school year: any potential change would take place in 2018-19.) The survey will provide four options. Survey participants will have a chance to rank the options in the order of their most preferred to least preferred choice. The survey will be open through June 30.
