School every day - it adds up

Attendance a priority for Lake Washington School District

September is Attendance Awareness Month. Districts and schools across the nation are highlighting the importance of consistent student attendance this month. Every absence, whether excused or unexcused, is a learning opportunity lost and can have significant effects on student success. Missing just two days a month adds up to 18 days per year, which is 10% of the school year. That level of absence means a student is, for example, less likely to read by the end of third grade.

In Lake Washington School District, about 10 percent of students missed 10 percent of school days last year. The district will continue to focus on the importance of attendance in the 2015-16 school year. "Every day in school adds up to more learning," said Dr. Traci Pierce, superintendent. "Schools, families and community partners working together can help students attend regularly. It starts with education about the importance of being in school every day." Read more.
