Ground broken for new elementary in North Redmond

Ground was broken on May 24 for the first of three new schools in Lake Washington School District. These schools are part of the district's overall Building on Success program. The new buildings are aimed at helping the district address its rapidly growing enrollment. The district is now the third largest district in the state, with just over 29,000 students.

"This is a very exciting time in Lake Washington School District," noted Dr. Traci Pierce, superintendent, who addressed the crowd. "We are growing. We are thriving. We are succeeding and we are building on that success."

Dr. Pierce introduced Karen Barker, who will serve as the school's first principal when it opens in September 2018. Barker is currently the principal of Dickinson Elementary School and Explorer Community School, also in Redmond.


Wall of woven fabric welcomes Sandburg/Discovery families for art walk
