# Reminder: Open enrollment is February 1-28

Lake Washington School District holds an open enrollment period once each year for parents who want their children to attend a school other than their neighborhood school. To take advantage of open enrollment for students in grades one through 12, parents may apply for a change to that school assignment, also known as an in-district transfer or variance, between February 1 and February 28.

For kindergarten students, parents must request the variance at the time of registration. This open enrollment option only applies to those schools that have space available. Read more.

# Prepared for the global workplace: February is Career and Technical Education (CTE) Month

February 1-28 is Career and Technical Education month. Approximately 6,287 students participate in 115 different career and technical education course options taught by 75 CTE teachers in Lake Washington School District If your students are in elementary school, they will begin to experience CTE courses in middle and high school.

## High School PE credit option deadlines coming up

To earn a high school diploma, students must earn two health and fitness credits. Some students may need an alternative option to meet the fitness portion of this requirement. These alternative options are available beginning in the student's 11th grade school year.

One option, the Fitness Knowledge Assessment, will be given on March 8. Students must register by February 15. For information on this option and how to sign up, go to the district website. Students who want to use a different option, the Fitness Plan, will need to submit their plan by March 8. The Fitness Plan directions will be available starting on February 6 on the district website.

# Reminder: Help Tesla STEM students win "Fan Favorite," make app to help disabled get around

It can be a challenge for someone with a disability to find comprehensive transportation information. Typical mapping tools don't include accessibility ramps or walking distances, for example. A team of students from Tesla STEM High School won \$5,000 from the <u>Verizon Innovative Learning app challenge</u> for their app concept, "Take Me There." This app would take advantage of crowdsourcing to help users who need more detailed
