# Choice School applications open; Middle school and high school options booklets available

Choice school applications are now available online for the 2017-18 school year. The deadline to apply is 4 p.m. January 20, 2017, for any school that relies on a lottery to determine enrollment.

Parents of students in grades five or eight should have received the <u>Middle School Options booklet</u> or <u>High School Options booklet</u>. They outline the opportunities in these respective levels, including information about neighborhood schools and choice schools. The booklets are also available on the <u>district website</u>. # Fifteen Lake Washington teachers achieve, renew National Board Certification

Two Lake Washington School District teachers achieved National Board Certification®, as announced by the <u>National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS)</u>. In addition to the two newly certified teachers, 13 teachers renewed their certification this year. That makes a total of 15 teachers completing the process. # **Student Growth Percentile (SGP) Reports**

The Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) has provided a new report that describes student academic growth on state tests over time. This report is called a Student Growth Percentile Report (SGP Report). Any student who has taken a state test for two consecutive years in grades 4 - 8 will receive a SGP report. The SGP reports are designed to help parents answer the following questions:

- How high is my child's score?
- What achievement level did he or she reach?
- How much progress did my child make in the past year?
- Is my child making enough progress towards reaching proficiency?

Students currently in grades 5-9 and with two years of test history will be receiving these reports in the next few weeks.

# Reminder: High School students can earn World Language credit through proficiency test

Students are required to graduate with two credits in a World Language. Students who have achieved some proficiency in a world language at home or in the community may seek to earn up to four World Language credits by taking an assessment that measures their proficiency. To use this option, students sign up to participate in "Washington World Language Assessment Days."

LWSD is offering two more testing opportunities for ninth-12th grade students in 2016-17. The cost of a first attempt during a student's high school career is free. Remaining testing opportunities for 2016-17 include:
