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#### A message from Dr. Traci Pierce, superintendent

The April 26, 2016, election results were certified May 6, and the bond passed with over 66% voter approval. On behalf of our 27,830 students, our district staff, and our Board of Directors, I want to express my deepest thanks and gratitude to our families and communities for supporting the bond measure! We can now begin work to reduce overcrowding and enhance learning environments for our students!

While the election is over and the bond has passed, this is just the beginning. We now begin the work of constructing schools and implementing the recommendations of the Long Term Facility Planning Task Force. We also continue planning for the subsequent bond measures upcoming in 2018, 2022, and 2026 to fully implement the projects recommended by the Task Force and ensure that we have classroom space through the 2030 school year for our ever-growing student population.

One of our strategic goals is to engage our communities. We are accountable to our communities to use resources responsibly and to ensure transparency in our work. The Long Term Facility Planning Task Force provided a number of recommendations for how the district can use cost effective design and construction principles and keep the community involved and informed with respect to our facility needs and construction projects.

One of the recommendations of the Long-Term Facilities Task Force was to create a committee of design and construction experts that would review and give input on major construction projects during the design phase of a project. Forrest Miller, the district's Director of Support Services, is a Certified Facility Manager (CFM), Recognized Educational Facility Planner (REFP), and Educational Facilities Master (EFM). Forrest oversees the district's Facility Services including construction and maintenance. Mr. Miller has now convened a Design and Construction Advisory Committee. Read more.

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Immunization information for fifth grade parents Washington State Law requires students entering the sixth grade to show proof of the following immunization:

 One dose of Tdap vaccine (to help prevent pertussis/whooping cough) for all children 11 years and older. Date of the last Tdap given must be <u>after</u> the 11th birthday.
