#### **High School PE Credit Options**

One and one half credits are required for graduation in the area of fitness. Physical education classes fulfill this requirement. High school students may be excused from participating in physical education classes on account of physical disability, employment, religious belief, participation in directed athletics or military science or for other good cause. Students must still demonstrate proficiency in the knowledge portion of the fitness requirement. Students in the class of 2016 and beyond may take the Fitness Knowledge Assessment or submit a Fitness Plan to fulfill this requirement. The Fitness Knowledge Assessment is offered three times a year. The first session for this school year will be October 26. Specific forms must be completed and students must register for this test at their high school. Students opting for the Fitness Plan will have three opportunities to submit their plan during the 2015-16 school year. The first deadline is on October 26. The district website provides more information and forms to fill out for students who are interested in these options.
