



While my friends were deciding between colleges I was trying to find a diagnosis. College seemed like an impossible dream. But SUU eased my worries. INCREDIBLE. I randomly found out about SUU's Jumpstart program and fell in love. I was able to get all my general education credits done in two semesters and I had such a blast doing it. I was able to have Biology class on hikes in Great Basin National Park, Astronomy after roasting s'mores at the campfire in Bryce Canyon National Park, and Photography class using the Grand Canyon as our subject. 


