Building on Success

February 13 Levy and Bond Measures

Lake Washington School District is planning for three ballot measures to go before voters in the district on February 13, 2018.



The **Education Programs and Operations Levy (EP&O)** funds program and operations needs not funded by the state. It helps pay for staffing for special education, highly capable, ELL, safety and security. It funds staff professional learning, teacher planning, the new teacher support program and training and workshops. It also pays for extracurricular activities and athletics; course offerings such as a 7-period high school day and early learning programs such as special preschool, Ready Start and Head Start. The levy currently funds 19.2% of the operating budget and must be renewed every four years.



The **Capital Projects Levy** funds critical facility and technology needs not funded by the state. The facility portion of this levy pays for building and system improvements, site improvements, field upgrades, portables, school improvements and health and safety compliance. The technology portion of this levy pays for infrastructure, such as networking and cloud storage, student and staff computers, classroom technology, security cameras, instructional software, business and support systems, and technology training and professional development. This levy must be renewed every four years.



The **bond measure** is the second of four planned bond measures to fulfill the Long-Term Facility Task Force recommendations. The measure will build one new elementary school and a new choice high school, remodel/rebuild and enlarge Alcott Elementary and Kamiakin Middle School, build an addition at Lake Washington High School and provide land for future projects and other capital projects.

These three measures will decrease the tax rate in our district from \$3.16 to \$2.93 per \$1,000 of Assessed Valuation. Choice School applications open; middle school and high school options booklets available

Choice school applications are now available online for the 2018-19 school year. **The deadline to apply is 4 p.m. January 19, 2018**, for any school that relies on a lottery to determine enrollment.

Parents of students in grades five or eight should have received the <u>Middle School Options booklet</u> or <u>High School Options booklet</u>. They outline the opportunities in these respective levels, including information about neighborhood schools and choice schools. The booklets are also available on the <u>district website</u>. Videos about each choice school are posted on the <u>district website</u> and <u>YouTube</u> <u>channel</u>.

NEW! Innovation Program

The district is pleased to announce a new Innovation Program. The goal is to recognize and incentivize innovative strategies and programs within our schools. The Innovation Program includes an Innovation Fund and an Innovative Program Designation. The Innovation Fund, with support from Lake Washington Schools Foundation, provides \$50,000 in grant funding for new innovation programs or to expand existing programs. Funds can be used for supplies, materials or training. The Innovative Program Designation provides recognition for existing and new innovation occurring in our schools. Innovation Fund grants are developed by principals working with their staff. <u>Visit the Innovation webpage for more information</u>.

World Language Competency Credit Opportunity

Students may develop world language skills in many ways. They may use another language at home, attend language programs in the community, learn language skills online or spend time living abroad. Students who have achieved some proficiency in a world language may seek to earn credit by taking an assessment that measures their proficiency.

Students who wish to pursue this option must sign up to participate in "Washington World Language Assessment Days." Through this program, students complete an assessment. If they demonstrate at

least a novice mid-proficiency level, they receive a certificate of recognition and a letter indicating proficiency levels and number of high school credits earned.

The Lake Washington School District offers five testing opportunities for 9th-12th grade students in 2017-18. The cost of a first attempt during a student's high school career is free. Read more information about the <u>LWSD World Language Credit Option</u> and sign up by January 4. Priority will be given to 11th and 12th graders if space becomes limited. Testing will be held on January 10, 2018 at 1:30 p.m. at Lake Washington High School. The deadline to register is January 4, 2018 at 11:59 p.m. Students must register on the <u>website</u>.

Season of Giving


Every year, in November and December, students, staff and parents in our district give back to our families and our community in many ways. Here are just a few examples:

- Franklin Elementary School donated 658 pounds of food to Hopelink at their Apple Cup-themed food drive. Husky fans brought in 407 pounds of food and Cougar fans brought in 251 pounds of food.
- Rockwell Elementary School's Student Leadership Group and fourth grade classes held a drive that brought in 285 toys for families in need.
- Finn Hill Middle School collected over 1,000 food items for Hopelink Pantry Packs.
- International Community School ASB organized a food and clothing drive for Youthcare in Seattle. They gathered more than 100 items of food, clothing, backpacks and sleeping bags.

RHS student wins Congressional App Challenge with app to make chemistry easy

In high school chemistry, you probably learned how to identify an unknown compound through a process called Qualitative Analysis: (1) Burning the compound to observe the color of the flame and (2) Dissolving the





compound in water to observe its precipitation.



Junior Pranav Vaid's award-winning app makes this process easier and faster by simulating the process. It reduces the Qualitative Analysis that would typically take two weeks when analyzed manually, down to a few hours.

The Redmond High School student is the winner of the 2017 Congressional App Challenge for Washington's 1st Congressional District. The office of Rep. Suzan DelBene announced the winner on Dec. 8.
