Replacement Capital Projects Levy focuses on maintaining and improving technology for students and staff

Providing students and staff with access to technology for learning is part of the Replacement Capital Projects Levy on the February 13 ballot. This levy funds critical technology needs not funded by the state, including:

- Technology Infrastructure and Support
- Equipment



- Instructional Software & Support Systems
- · Business & Technology Systems
- Technology Training & Professional Development

LWSD moves to seven-period high school schedule for 2018-19 school year

For two years, the College and Career Readiness Task Force, consisting of staff and parents, studied ways to expand options for high school students, to help them meet the state's new 24 credit graduation requirement. Students in the class of 2019 and beyond will need 24 credits to earn a high school diploma. The Task Force reviewed several scheduling options and models, all with the aim of increasing flexibility for every student. In April 2017, having taken staff, student, and parent survey feedback into consideration, the Task Force recommended adding instructional time to the high school day to create a seven-period high school schedule.

The seven-period high school day offers equity and opportunity for all students. Students have more opportunities for:

- **Exploration** taking different or additional elective courses
- Acceleration taking courses such as Advanced Placement (AP), dual credit opportunities like Running Start, or College in the High School
- Remediation getting additional support or making up credit

Our high schools are planning for the transition to seven-period schedules to take effect with the start of the 2018-19 school year.

Registration window for Advanced Placement (AP) exams opens soon

The registration window for Advanced Placement (AP) exams is a little earlier this year than in past years. Registration will take place from February 21 through March 7. AP exam dates are May 7 to May 18 with late AP exam dates from May 23 to 25. Students will receive registration materials in their AP classes. If your student is enrolled in an AP class, please remind him/her to sign up by 1 p.m. on March 7 to be able to take the exam. Reminder: Tell your neighbors and friends: Kindergarten Registration for 2018-19 starts February 1

If you live in Lake Washington School District (LWSD) and your child will be 5 years old on or before August 31, 2018, it is time to register him or her for kindergarten. Registration takes place at your neighborhood school, beginning **February 1 from 1-7 p.m.** and continuing during regular school hours through the beginning of the 2018-19 school year.

While registration will continue throughout the school year and summer, parents are highly encouraged to register students as soon as possible. Doing so helps ensure class sizes are balanced and adequate staff are hired in time for the new school year.

Attending one of the new elementary schools next fall? Registration for the two new schools will take place on Wednesday, February 7 from 3:30-7 p.m. at the following locations:

- North Redmond: Redmond Middle School (10055 166th Avenue NE, Redmond, WA 98052)
- Redmond Ridge East: Rosa Parks Elementary (22845 NE Cedar Park Crescent, Redmond, WA 98053)

Lake Washington Schools Open Enrollment is February 1-28, 2018

Most schools closed to those outside their area

Lake Washington School District holds an open enrollment period once each year for parents who want their children to attend a school other than their neighborhood school. Parents may apply between February 1-28 for a change to the school assignment for the 2018-19 school year for their student in grades 1-12. This option is also known as an In-District Variance.

This open enrollment option only applies to neighborhood schools that have space available. The list of schools that are closed to students outside their neighborhood will be available on the district website on January 31, <u>available here</u>. Schools are closed if current and projected enrollment shows that students who live within their attendance boundary will fill the school's capacity. District enrollment has increased rapidly over the last seven years. It is likely that very few schools will be on the list of open schools. <u>Learn more on the In-District Variance webpage</u>.

Upcoming deadlines: Alternative options for high school PE credit

To earn a high school diploma, students must earn 1.5 fitness credits. There may be special circumstances where a student may have an alternative option to meet this fitness-credit requirement. These alternative options are available beginning in the student's 11th grade school year.

One option, the Fitness Knowledge Assessment, will be given on February 28. For information on this option and how to sign up, go to <u>the district website</u>. Students who want to use a different option, the Fitness Plan, will need to submit their plan by February 28. <u>The Fitness Plan directions are available</u> on the district website.
