It is incredibly rewarding and emotional to hear students speak of their educational experiences in Lake Washington, thank the many teachers and staff members who helped them succeed, and share their future plans. At a recent LWPTSA Council meeting I shared that our district's graduation rate has reached 93.3% - the highest of the largest 49 districts in the state. New Spanish-English Dual Language Choice Program

Lake Washington School District is developing a new dual language Spanish-English choice program to open at Einstein Elementary School starting in the 2018-19 school year. The dual language program will have instruction in two languages, with half of the day taught entirely in Spanish, and the other half in English. Each dual language class is composed of approximately 50% native Spanish speakers and 50% English speakers. Next year, the program will include one kindergarten class and one first grade class, depending on enrollment. An additional grade level will be added each following year. The goals of the program are for students to:

- Be bilingual
- · Be biliterate
- Demonstrate high academic achievement
- · Develop multicultural skills

Students who reside within the Einstein attendance area will have preference for enrollment in the program. We anticipate that a limited number spaces will be available for kindergarten and first grade native Spanish-speaking students (3-8 spaces/class) and English-speaking students (3-5 spaces/class) who reside outside the Einstein attendance area. If more students apply than there are spaces, students will be selected for these spaces using the choice school lottery process.

There will be a family information night about the new dual language program on Wednesday, May 16 from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at the Lake Washington School District Resource Center,16250 NE 74th Street, Redmond, WA 98052. Additional information about the program will be posted on our choice school information web page. The online application for the program will open on May 17.

Ella Baker Elementary staff get the first glimpse inside their new school

Teachers and staff were all smiles when they arrived at Ella Baker Elementary School. The new school, under construction at Redmond Ridge East, will help ease overcrowding by providing space for 690 elementary students. Teachers will welcome the school's first students in less than four months.

It didn't take long for the music teacher to find her classroom. The elevated room can be converted to a stage overlooking the gym/cafeteria. With tears of joy, she happily exclaimed to planning principal Kim Bilanko, "I don't have a tissue, Kim!"

The school's future librarian visited the site in February to provide feedback on utilizing the bright, welcoming space that will hold books for grades K-5.

Ella Baker Elementary is one of eight projects funded by the 2016 bond to reduce overcrowding. The bond was the first to pass since 2006. Funds from the bond are building additional space for 3,000 students.

The district has grown by about 5,000 students in the last seven years. The LWSD School Board continues to look at next steps to accommodate our growing student population.

As students returned from spring break, construction on their new Juanita High School was moving forward. The first concrete pour on April 10 set the footings for the school's foundation. With parking reduced due to construction, more students have been carpooling and riding the bus. JHS staff and Kirkland Police also helped families navigate revised drop-off and parking routines. Construction workers and staff expressed appreciation for the positive attitudes of parents, students and the community.

Important Reminders & Updates

Romaine lettuce retdhool lunches

Lake Washington School District and Sodexo partner to provide only the safest products to you and your children. We do everything we can to ensure the safety of the food we serve, often exceeding

health department standards. When something happens, like the recent industry-wide issues affecting romaine lettuce harvested in Yuma, Arizona, we act quickly to remove the risk from our schools and service points.

From the moment the advisory was issued by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on April 13, 2018, we pulled all romaine and placed it on hold. Once we determined what was affected we discarded all romaine on hand and sourced product from an unaffected region.

You can rest assured that we are only sourcing our romaine from the California area. That means that the lettuce now found in the salads and sandwiches on our menu is unaffected by the recall and not included in the CDC advisory. We hope this helps to ease your mind, and invite you and your children the opportunity to continue to enjoy our safe and healthy options including Caesar Salads and lettuce blends on our salad bars.

Attention fifth-grade parents: New Tdap vaccination requirement

A letter was sent out recently to the parents of fifth grader students, reminding them that to enter the sixth grade, they must show proof of one dose of the Tdap vaccine (to help prevent pertussis/whooping cough) for all children 11 years and older. The deadline to turn in this form is June 1, 2018. The form is also available on the district website. If you have any questions, please contact your school nurse.

Reminder: Tell your neighbors and friends: Kindergarten Registration for 2018-19

If you live in Lake Washington School District (LWSD) and your child will be 5 years old on or before August 31, 2018, it is time to register him or her for kindergarten. Registration takes place at your neighborhood school during regular school hours through the beginning of the 2018-19 school year.

While registration will continue throughout the school year and summer, parents are highly encouraged to register students as soon as possible. Doing so helps ensure class sizes are balanced and adequate staff are hired in time for the new school year.
