Superintendent Search Update

The Lake Washington School District Board of Directors is working with Ray and Associates, a Superintendent Search firm, to hire the next LWSD Superintendent. Starting in late April, Ray and Associates held five community forums and 32 focus groups around the community. They also posted two surveys on the LWSD website, gathering 1,470 responses. The results of those meetings, focus groups and surveys are posted on the <u>Superintendent Search webpage</u>. This feedback also informed the creation of the job profile, also available on the LWSD website.

The job is now posted, and is open through June 4. An **updated timeline** is available on the <u>Superintendent Search webpage</u>.

New seasons and a new sport for middle school athletics in 2018-19

Middle school sport seasons are changing for the 2018-19 school year so that there will be at least one sport every season for every gender and every grade.

These changes come from recommendations following a two-year study of the middle school athletic program which were informed by several student surveys. The study group was tasked with making recommendations to address equity in athletic programming, capacity issues with court sports, and transportation costs.

New student laptop selected!

After a rigorous Request for Information (RFI) process, a new student laptop has been selected for grade 6 and 9 students. The Hewlett Packard x360 G2 with an M3 processor was chosen, as it most closely aligned with our requirements specified in the RFI. The review process spanned four months and included assessment of pricing, serviceability, performance, community feedback, and quality assurance testing. Based on feedback and data, the HP x360 was the clear choice.

The device has a long battery life with working time up to 11 hours and weighs 3.2 pounds, which is 1.1 pounds lighter than the last model. In addition, the device includes a pen that allows for digital inking, which allows students to take full advantage of the tablet qualities. The laptops are being prepared for back-to-school deployment.

Lake Washington School District partners with King County Metro to offer free ORCA cards to eligible students

LWSD is partnering with King County Metro to offer free unlimited ORCA passes to eligible high school students to help them get around during the summer. Representatives Vandana Slatter (Bellevue) and Mia Gregerson (SeaTac) secured funding through Transportation Budget Proviso – SSB 5096 to run the program as a pilot in LWSD and Highline Public Schools during the summer of 2018. The ORCA unlimited passes will work from May 14, 2018 to September 7, 2018. Only students who qualify for free and reduced price lunch are eligible for the program. Applications are available online or in each high school office.

2018-19 School Start Times Update

Many families have connected with the District through our Let's Talk tool to share their questions and concerns about the change to school start/end times for 2018-19. One of the main concerns we have heard is the need for before/after school care for elementary students. As a result, Lake Washington School District staff are working to add more space to its current Extended Day programs. There is a need to hire additional staff to accommodate more students in these programs. More information about this program expansion will be shared with families directly through the schools.

Lake Washington School District receives clean audit

Each year, the Washington State Auditor's Office conducts two audits of our district: Accountability and Financial Statements and a Federal Single Audit. The district received clean audits. The accountability audit examines financial records, reviews compliance with laws and regulations and reviews whether districts have effective internal controls. The financial and federal single audit issues an opinion on the fair presentation of our financial statements and reviews compliance with federal grant requirements.

The auditor was very complimentary of the work done by our staff and their cooperation with the audit team. The auditor highlighted that our results are excellent, especially given the size and complexity of our district. Audit reports can be found on the <u>Washington State Auditor's Office website</u>.

New elementary schools countdown: 100 days!

Like other elementary schools, Clara Barton Elementary in north Redmond and Ella Baker Elementary at Redmond Ridge east will host meet-and-greets leading up to the first day of school on Sept. 4 – in just 100 days (on Sunday)!

But for the planning principals, there is work to do before moving into their new schools. The two have been busy hiring and ordering classroom furniture. The growing teams of teachers and staff meet regularly to discuss school vision and logistics.

Families also receive regular communications about upcoming family nights, the new PTSAs and the fifth-grade fall camp.

Principals Kim Bilanko and Karen Barker actually met and became friends in second grade. Barker's school in Bellevue had closed and boundary changes put them in the same school. "I remember being worried about moving to a new school," Barker recalls. "But Woodridge felt like home right away! Kim and her friends were very welcoming. We want to be sure that our new schools feel like home next year!"

The new elementary schools are two of eight projects funded by voters in 2016 to help reduce overcrowding. The Lake Washington School District is now the third largest district in the state, up from sixth largest in 2014.
