# Update: Washington's Integrated System of Monitoring (WISM) Onsite Review

OSPI conducts annual reviews of selected school districts in the state using Washington's Integrated System of Monitoring (WISM). This year, Lake Washington was selected for monitoring, which included an onsite review by OSPI monitors, as referenced above. This onsite portion of the monitoring process was conducted on March 28 and 29. The onsite monitoring included meetings with members of our Central Leadership Team, focus groups with district parents and staff, classroom observations and interviews of teachers and Special Education Specialists. OSPI will be sending our district a formal summary of their onsite visit results within the next several weeks. Overall, the OSPI monitoring team was very complimentary of our Special Education department, and of the teachers, staff, administrators and parents with whom they met.
