Does our school offer GED?

- ▶ Adults can earn a High School Diploma, OR
- ▶ Students can choose to prepare for GED, TASC or HiSET exams*



***LASCC can only help students prepare. We are not a test site for these exams.**

Which is faster? GED, TASC, HI-Set exams or High School Diploma?

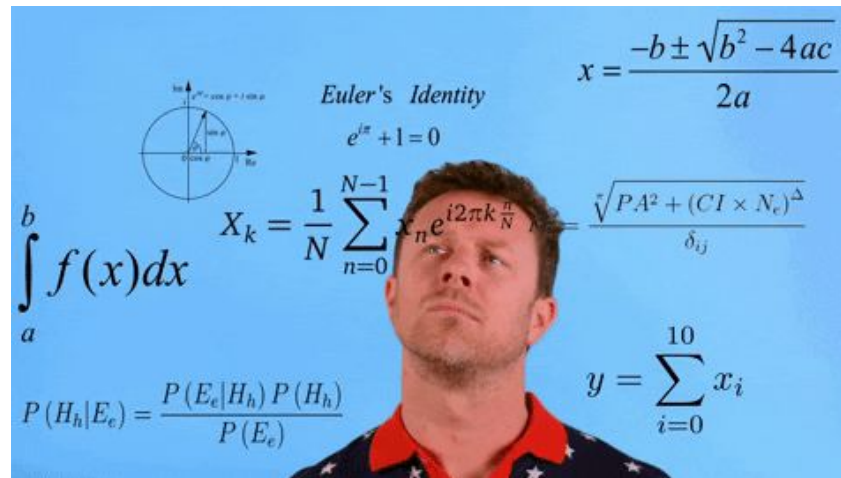


Most students can earn a diploma faster than they can prepare for the exams.

How many credits do I need to graduate?

Students need the following to graduate:

A. 10 credits of each:

US History World History English 9 English 10 English 11 Math
Algebra Life Science Earth Science Fine Arts/CTE/Language

A. 5 credits of each: Government Economics

B. AND students need the following

Students under 21 need 90 elective credits

Students over 21 need 50 elective credits

How to Graduate: Enrolling Step 1

1. Enroll Online at lUSD.org/las into the Academic Orientation date of your choice.
2. Request Official High School transcripts from your most recent school attended.
3. Receive a Zoom meeting code from LASCC within two business days of the Academic Orientation.
4. Attend the Zoom meeting to ask questions about the program.
5. Work with the Newcomer Teacher Lesley Davis to complete all of your requirements.

What do Newcomer Students have to complete?

1. Attend orientation
2. Zoom Meet one-on-one with Teacher Lesley Davis.
3. Complete all required assessments for new students: CASAS, Math, English
4. Zoom Meet with Megan Mance, Career Technician
5. Check in weekly with Teacher Lesley Davis
6. Zoom Meet with Schel Brown, Academic Dean, to review transcript evaluation
7. Be dismissed from the Newcomer class by Lesley Davis

How Long do I Stay a Newcomer?

Students stay in the Newcomer class until they have completed all steps in the Newcomer process.

Usually students leave the Newcomer class after two weeks.

How do I know what classes I need to graduate

- ▶ Before you start classes, LASCC must have received your official transcript.
- ▶ The LASCC registrar will review your transcript and create an evaluation that tells you what classes you need to graduate.
- ▶ You will receive a copy of the evaluation when it is complete.

Can I choose which classes I take first?

- ▶ All students begin with a math and reading assessment.
- ▶ Students who score low in these assessments may need to complete their math and English courses first to improve their skills for other courses.
- ▶ Once students have completed math and English, students may decide in what order they wish to complete all other courses in Social Studies, Science, Fine Arts, and Electives.

Why is there more than one teacher?

The program has several teachers.

- ▶ One Newcomer teacher
- ▶ English teacher
- ▶ One math teacher
- ▶ One Diploma program teacher
- ▶ All students work with the Diploma teacher.
- ▶ Some students work with the math and/or English teacher.
