From their commitment to serve the poor, sick and uneducated, the Sisters of Mercy grew into thousands across the globe, reaching the United States in 1843 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and establishing foundations throughout the U.S.

GROW Enrichment Event

School gardens can provide an engaging space for limitless learning opportunities. The Parent Association is proud to sponsor a school tulip garden to connect students to plants, soil, ecology, and other hands-on experimental learning. In the month of December, a video will be shown from Wicked Tulip Farm on how they plant thousands of tulips each year. Then each student will be given a bulb and shovel to plant their own tulip. Winter Sports Update
