So this was the year that was, 2019-20, a year never to be forgotten, the year that students will tell their children about in future years.

The year started well with a brand new ECA program, with an increase in ECA allocated time of 4 lessons every 2 weeks to 10 lessons. Students trained with their soccer coach on pitches beside Yatai stadium, and basketball in the complex beside school, as well as hiking in Jing Yue park.

CAIS students also had their first competitive games in Basketball and Soccer for the first time in several years. We were building slowly towards the more holistic model of education that we have planned for. We also launched the new CAIS website after several months of development in December 2019 and created a new EAL Dept to give students targeted assistance for English language support.

However, at the end of January students and teachers were instructed to stay at home for several months without seeing their friends or going to school and this has affected them and their families many in different ways.

For the first time some have understood that school and education is a very important part of their lives, not only for academic reasons but is an integral part of their social and emotional development. Students at CAIS and all across the world were isolated from their friends and wider family and they made the best that they could of the situation.





Students, teachers and parents all had to adapt to a new way of working. It was with great relief that we were able to finally reopen the doors on April 20th, but joy was tempered by the fact that it was only MYP4, 5 and DP2. DP1 joined the teaching staff back at CAIS.

Every CAIS student who has returned to school has been given the opportunity to fill any possible gaps in their educational development because of this special period. Students worked with their teachers to identify work that they may have missed and work that could be repeated and resubmitted. For the rest of the academic year ECAs were given over to this task, as well as after school and Saturdays from 9-1 pm, plus summer School Summer Camp sessions.

The CAIS tree has deep roots and has weathered this unexpected storm. There are still challenges to come and we are making several contingency plans as we face the new realities of how school will operate in 2020. We already have many new plans for the next academic year and look forward to seeing the students return. For those of you that are not returning we thank you for your participation in the CAIS story and we wish you the best of luck in your next steps.

The 2020 graduation ceremony was given permission to proceed, however in a very different format, parents and guests could not attend, only graduating students and teachers. We wish all graduates the best of luck in your next exciting steps.

2019-20 has been a very challenging year for MYP students. During this period 186 countries around the world closed schools, which represents more than 90% of students globally. Our MYP students were amongst the lucky ones who could continue to work online. Despite this, it was a very challenging time for our students and teachers. We all had to devote extra time to improving our time management skills and avoiding distractions at home. In Semester 1, we introduced Chinese Studies for non-Chinese MYP1-4 students to learn more about the culture, language and history of the country in which we all live. This academic year, we had an increase in first language learning, with Korean being added to our suite of IB “Mother Tongues” or Language and Literature subjects. Some students also committed to self-study in their mother tongue. First language learning is very important due the power it has to shape our thinking and emotions as well as it’s identity-building capacity. In the next school year we will again expand our language repertoire by adding German Language Acquisition (for non-native speakers).

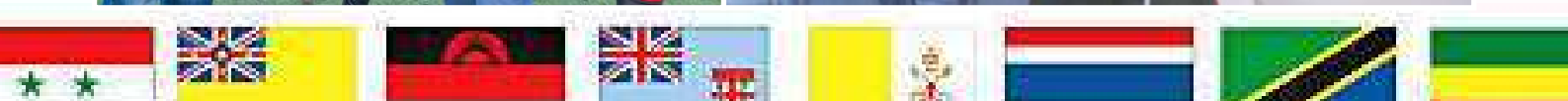
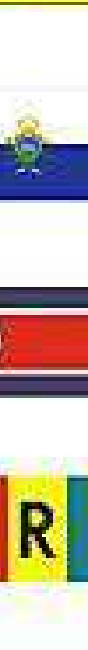


International Community Festival

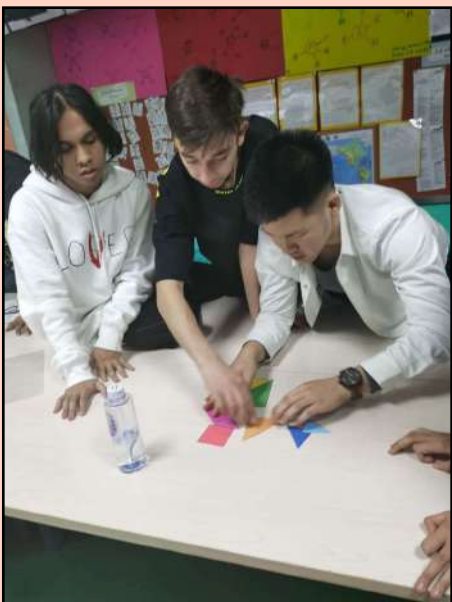

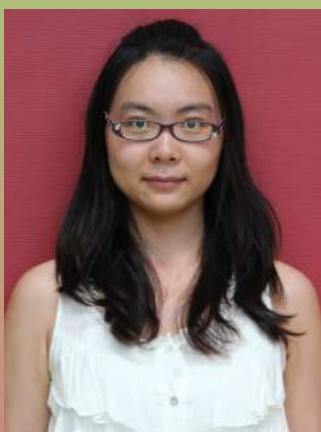
