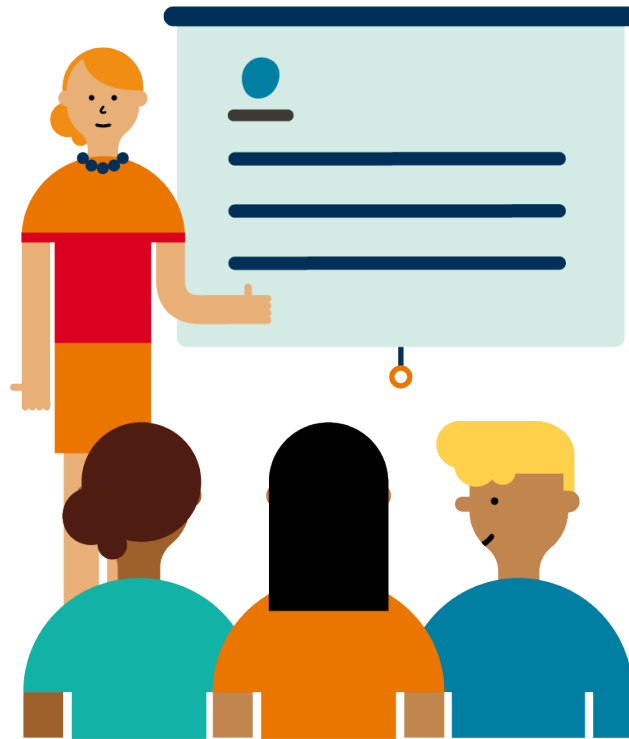

How to Take a Test Online

The next few slides will explain these steps:


- 1 Sign in
- 2 Enter the online test passcode
- 3 Answer the questions using the tools provided
- 4 Check your answers
- 5 Submit your test

Sign in

Sign in to Schoolnet

- 1. Go to tx.schoolnet.com*
- 2. Select your District from the "Sign in with" dropdown*
- 3. Enter username and password provided by your teacher (or District)*
- 4. If EOY or BOY assessment taken at same District, student credentials will be the same.*



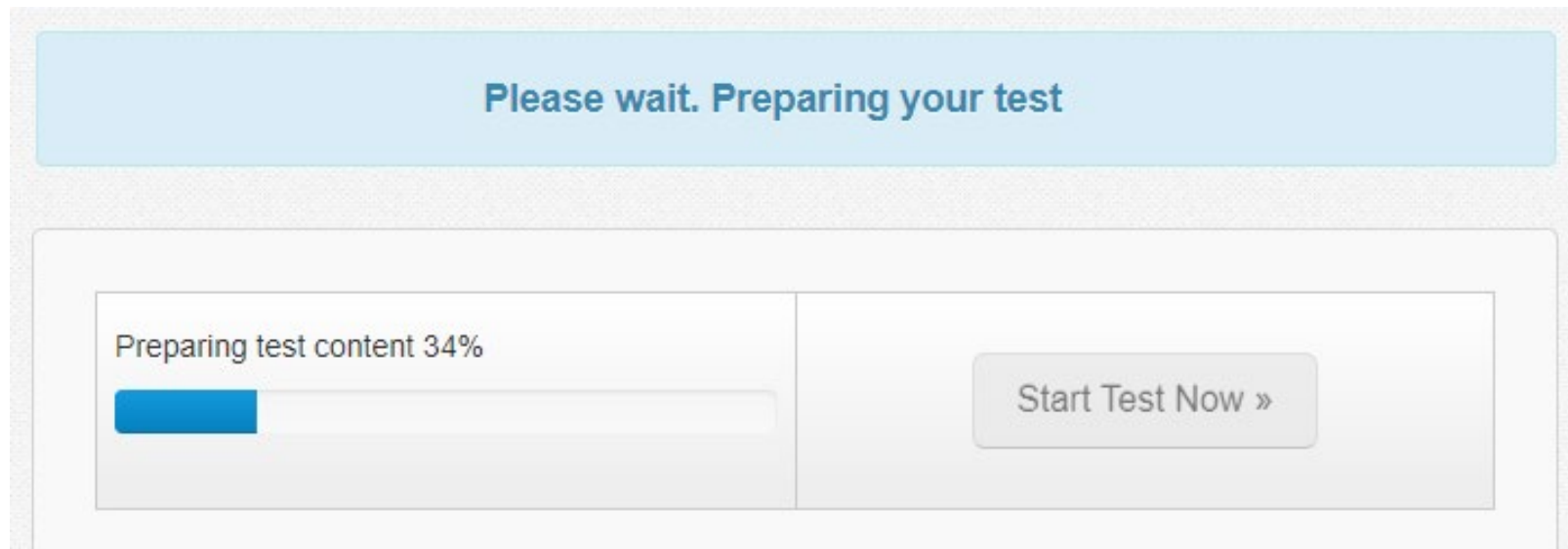

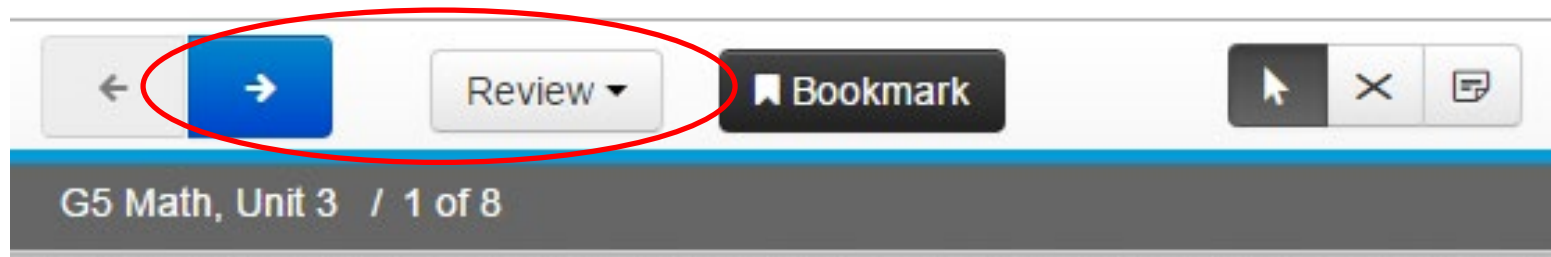
It takes just a moment for the test to load. Once the **Start Test Now** button turns blue, click it to start.



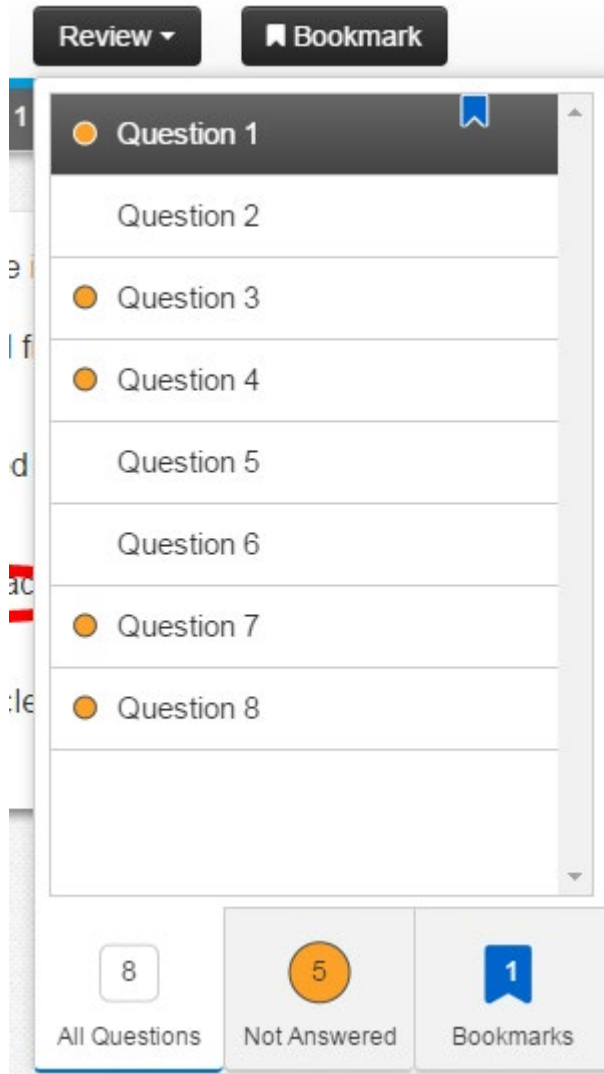
Taking Your Test

Navigate Among Questions

- Use the right arrow to move to the next question
- Click **Review** to jump to any question




Bookmark Items



- If you aren't sure about your answer choice, bookmark the item to review it later, if you have time
- A blue flag appears in the review menu so you can quickly jump to bookmarked items

Answer Eliminator

If you aren't sure of the right answer, but can eliminate some, it may be helpful to cross those out

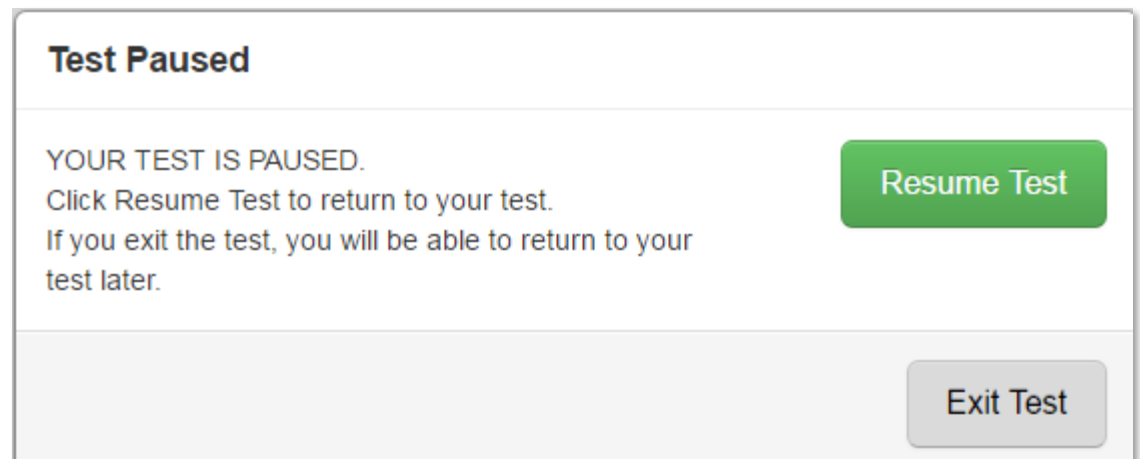
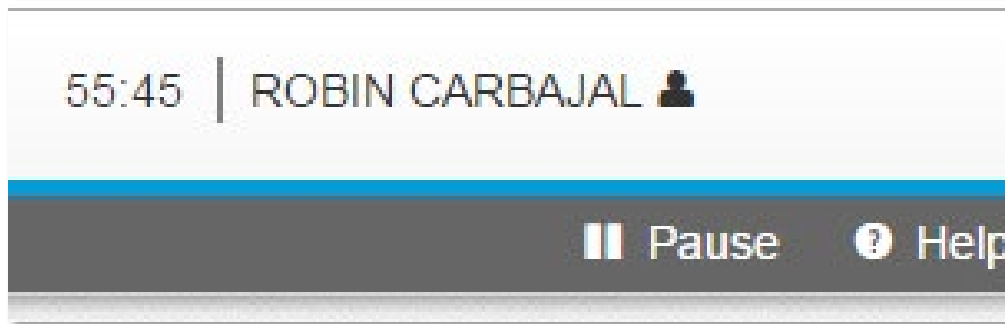


Pausing a Test

Use the **Review** button above to go back and review your answers. When you are done, use the **Submit Final Answers** button below to submit your answers.

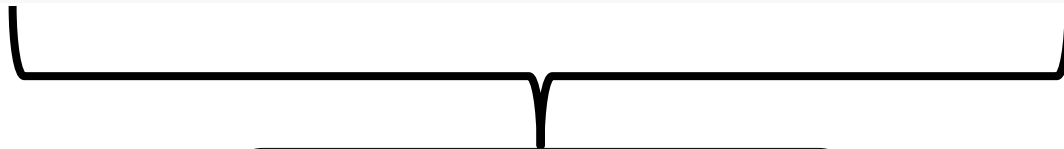
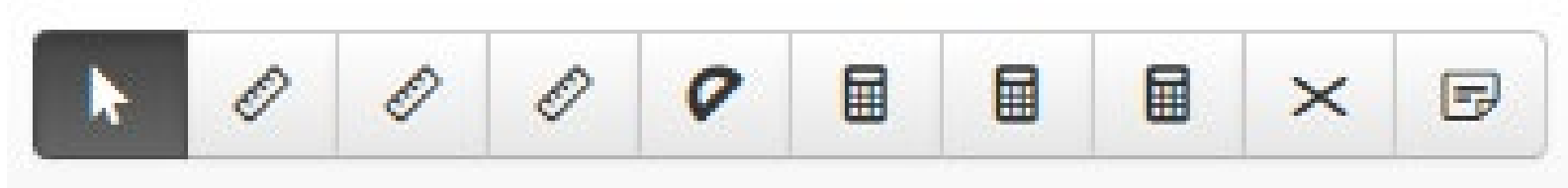

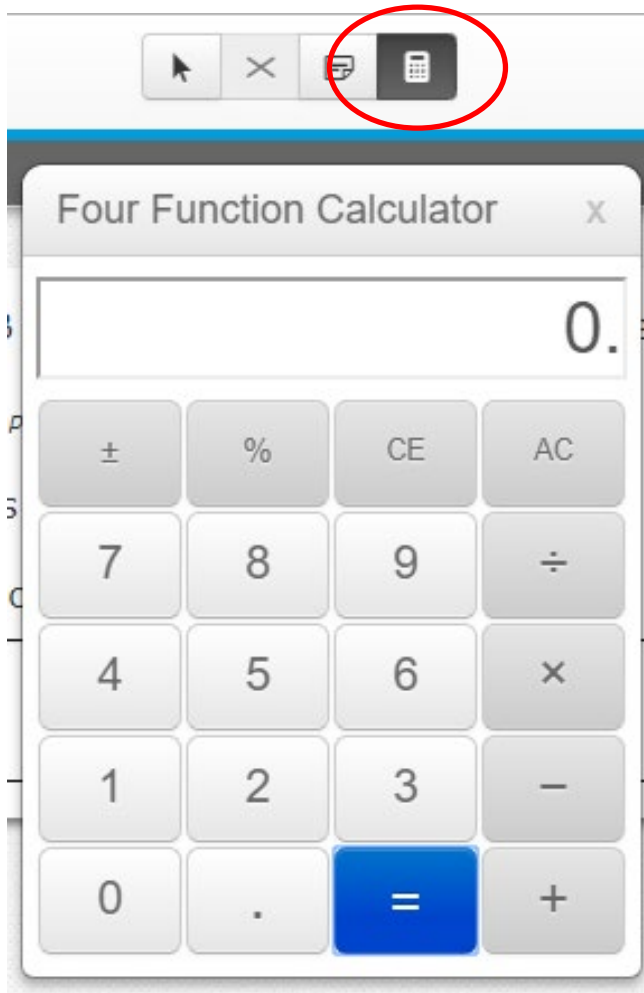

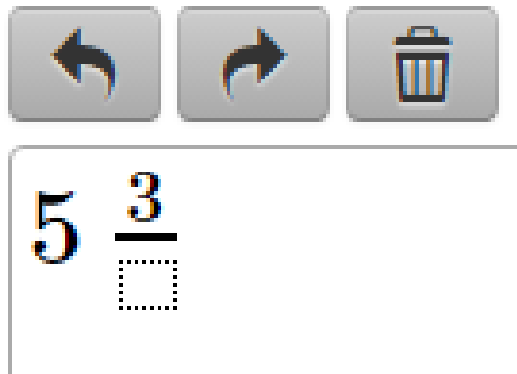
Calculator

Other Special Features

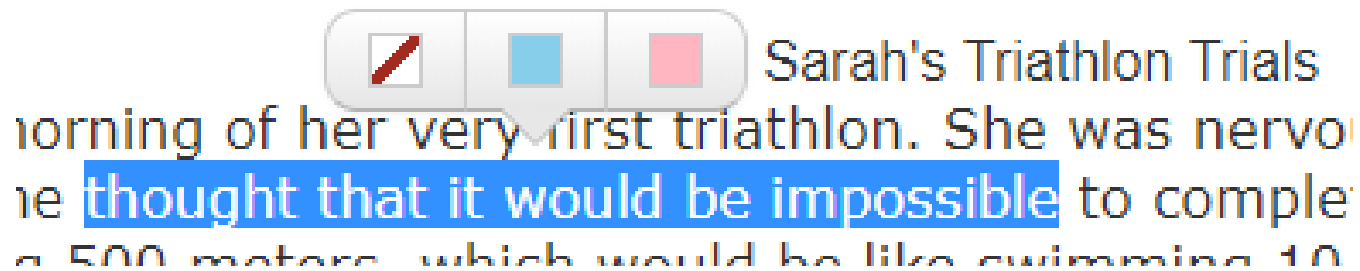
Passages

- Use scroll bar to view long passages
- You can highlight key text
- Sometime tests have two passages with tabs to navigate back and forth

How to Highlight a Passage or Item

To highlight text you think might be important to review as you answer the questions, highlight the text with your cursor and then click the pink or blue square. (Use the other icon to remove highlighting.)



Open Response Items

- For some questions, you'll type an answer in a text field
- A basic formatting toolbar may be available

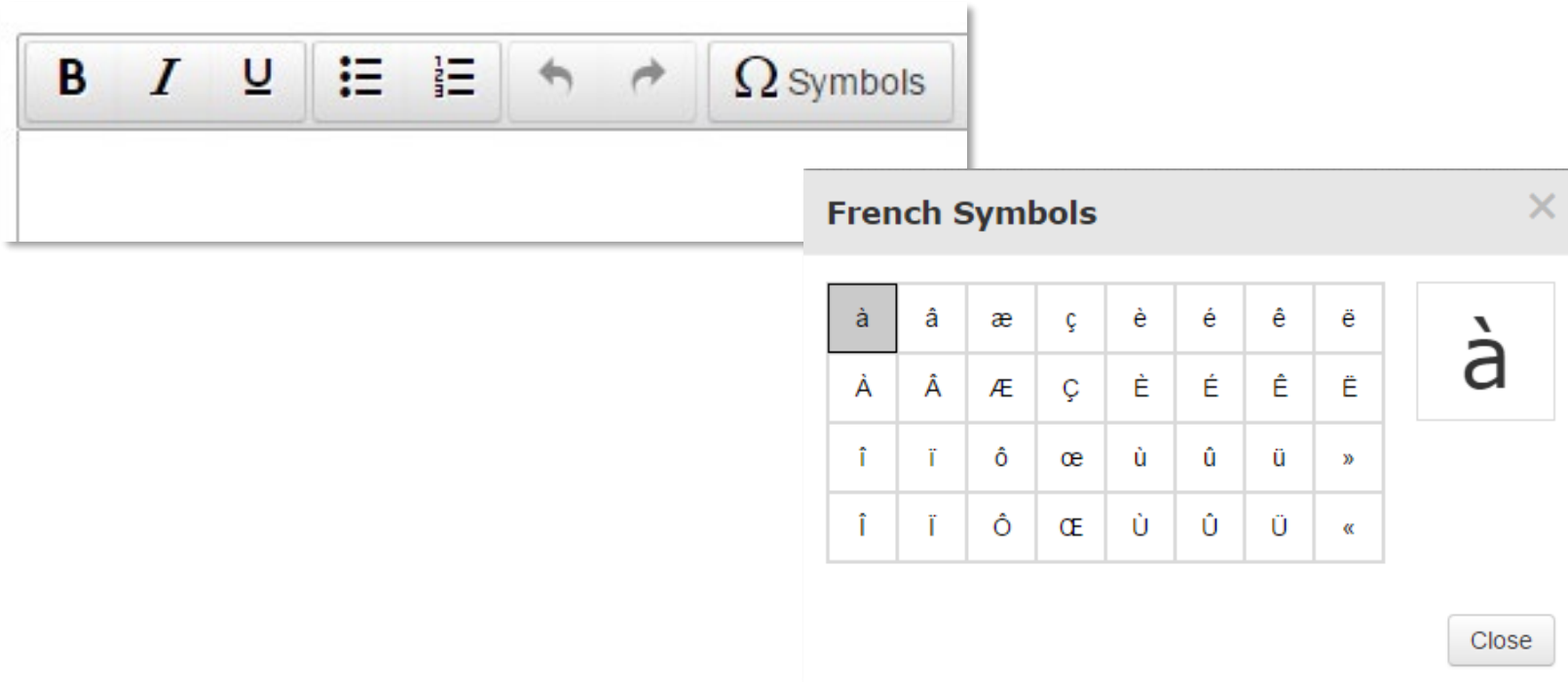
In retrospect, the reader often discovers that the first chapter of a novel or the opening scene of a drama introduces some of the major themes of the work. Write an essay about the opening scene of a drama or the first chapter of a novel in which you explain how it functions in this way.

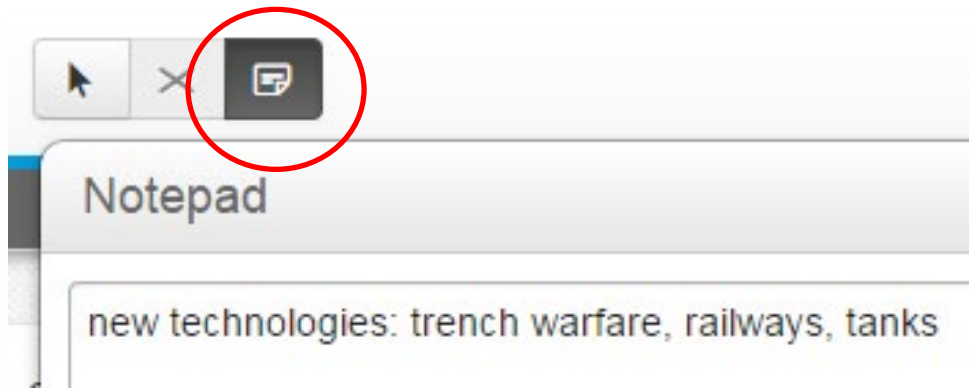
Characters for French and Spanish Open Response Items

For some tests, the formatting toolbar may include a special character button. Click the special character button to open a selection of foreign language characters.



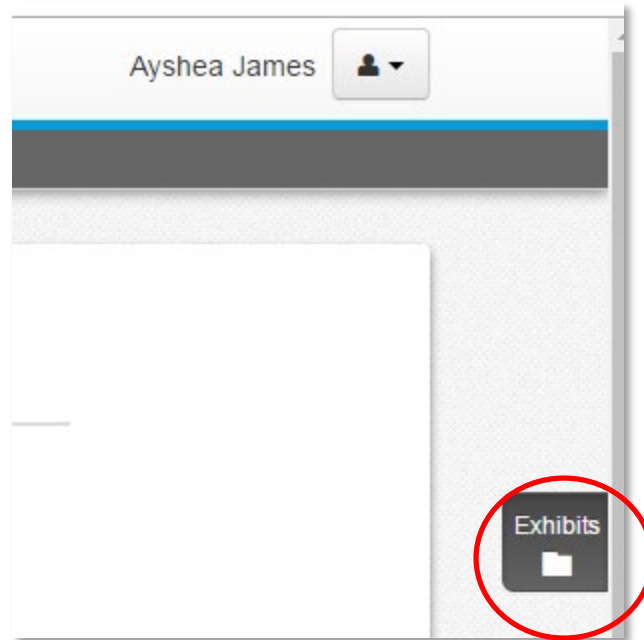
Notepad

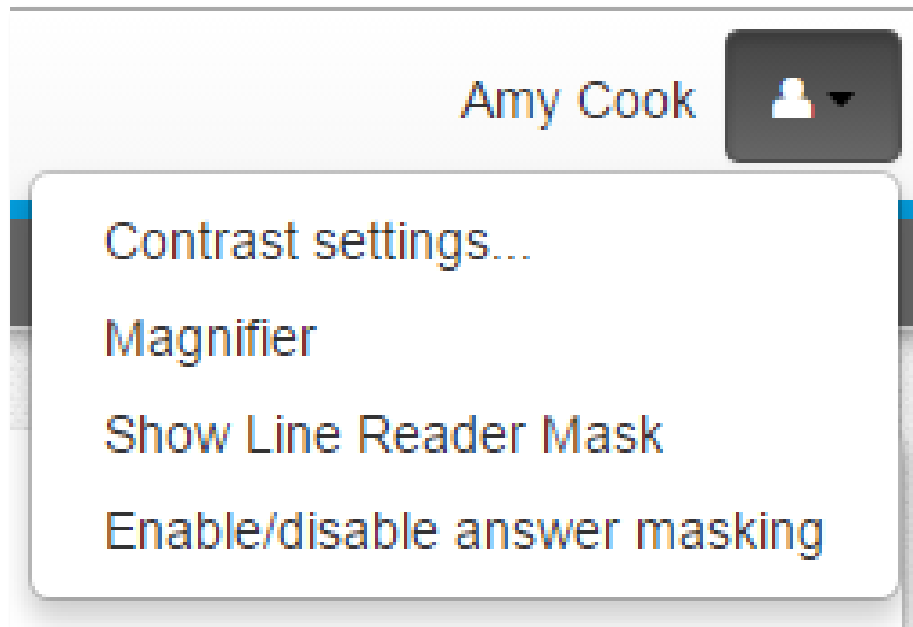

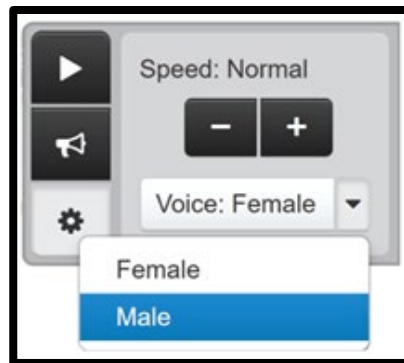
Test Aids

If made available to you, use the options in the menu to turn on and off any available test aids as needed.



Text to Speech

If made available to you, some tests have a read aloud feature. Press the Play button to listen. Click the Gear icon to open settings for speed, volume and gender of speaker. The Click to Hear (middle) button allows you to select a specific line of text to hear.
