Dear Gull Lake Families,

As a District, we are committed to maintaining standards for mitigating the spread of COVID, and to fielding a team to be able to deliver a variety of programs and options during this extended period of uncertainty brought about by the Pandemic. We continue to offer in-person learning and remote virtual instruction options for Y5-12th grade students under the supervision of our local Health team led by Nurse Megan and our Kalamazoo Health and Community Services team.

Lyndi K. Warner, Administration & Operations Supervisor for the Kalamazoo County Health and Community Services department, issued a statement this week in support of all modes of instruction that local districts are offering. She also supports recommendations that any families who have travelled over the Thanksgiving Holiday outside of their normal social bubble to consider self-quarantining until they have had more time to observe for potential COVID-19 symptoms. If you fall into this category, remaining symptom free for ten days following outside social contact is the recommendation before returning to work or school according to CDC guidelines.

On Monday, we return to the classroom for in-person learning for those who have chosen this option grades Y5-8th. This follows a three-week pause while our team monitored, and contact traced a local surge in positive cases within the community that impacted several students and staff. In the course of delivering all of our learning options, the daily sacrifices made by the GLCS team have not gone unnoticed and are deeply appreciated by everyone who has a stake in maintaining and growing a quality comprehensive educational program within our District. Please follow the guidance listed above in order to fully support the health, safety and well-being of *all* members of our school family.
