Located on a 14.5-acre campus, ASF enrolls on average 2,548 students in four schools: Early Childhood Center (three-year-olds, pre-kinder and kindergarten), Lower School (grades 1-5), Middle School (grades 6-8) and Upper School (grades 9-12).

## ACCREDITATION AND CURRICULUM

The American School Foundation (ASF) is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), a part of Cognia (formerly AdvanEd). Through this accreditation, all students receive a U.S. high school diploma. Students may also enroll in the Mexican University Program in grades 7–12, where additional classes are taught to fulfill Mexican National Spanish language and social studies requirements. The students' studies in grades 7–12 may be re-validated by the Ministry of Public Education (SEP) and/or the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), thus allowing students to study in Mexico and abroad.



ASF offers the International Baccalaureate Primary Years (PYP), Middle Years (MYP) and Diploma Programmes. All students in grades 6–8 are enrolled in the MYP to ensure they receive an education that focuses on the ideals of international understanding and world citizenship. Students may apply for the IB Diploma Programme during their junior and senior years. Qualified students may be approved by department and based on grades, NWEA scores, PSAT scores, and placement tests are permitted to enroll in individual IB and/or AP courses as well as work towards earning the AP International Diploma and/or AP Capstone Diploma.

## ACADEMIC CALENDAR AND SCHEDULE

There are 190 school days divided into two semesters. The first semester begins in early-August and concludes in December. The second semester begins the second week of January and concludes the first week of June. **Mid-year grades are available in January.** Classes meet every other day for 75 minutes on a standard A–B block schedule. There are four class periods per day.

### COVID-19 RELATED DISRUPTIONS

ASF began distance learning on March 17, 2020 and continued off campus until the end of the Spring 2020 semester on June 11. Classes resumed for the Fall 2020 semester using a distance learning model (ASF@Home) on August 10, 2020. As of September 1, the March, May, June, September, and October SAT Test dates have been canceled at ASF as well as the April, June, August, and October ACT Test dates. While the school is using the ASF@Home modality during the Fall 2020 semester, classes will be meeting twice a week for 75 minutes on a standard A–B schedule with Wednesday being a “flex” day.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

### IB AND AP COURSES

The following are the requirements for the graduating class of 2021.

The successful completion of each yearlong course earns one unit of credit; a semester course counts as half a unit. The American School requires 27 units for graduation. All units must be completed between grades 9 through 12. Students must take a minimum of seven courses per semester in grades 9–11 and a minimum of 6 in grade 12.

- 4** units of English (one per year)
- 4** units of Language and/or Literature other than English (one per year)  
Minimum 2.0 units of Spanish for students not enrolled in the Mexican Program (can be met with ACTFL placement)
- .5** unit of Health (preferably taken in grade 9)
- Minimum **.5** unit of Physical Education (participation in sports at the junior varsity or varsity level can substitute)

- 4** units of Lab Science (one per year)  
To include 1.0 unit each of: Biology, Chemistry and Physics
- Minimum **3** units of Mathematics (must include completion of Algebra II)
- Minimum **1.5** units of Arts and Design
- Minimum **.5** unit of Coding (must include completion of Algebra II)  
Can be met by any of the following:
  - Creative Coding (.5)
  - Web Design (.5)
  - AP Computer Science A (1.0)
  - AP Computer Science Principles (1.0)

- 3.5** units of Humanities in English (one per year — U.S. and Mexican Programs)  
Students are required to take World History and a course that satisfies the ASF U.S. History Requirement. The following courses fulfill this requirement:
  - U.S. History
  - AP U.S. History
  - IB History of the Americas HL (Y2)

- .5** additional units of Humanities in English (U.S. program only)  
To include: Survey of Mexican History (one semester)
- .5** additional units of Humanities in English (Mexican program only)  
To include: Psychology (one semester)
- 4.5** additional units of Humanities in Spanish (Mexican program only)  
To include: Historia de México I, Geografía, Historia de México II, Filosofía\*, Derecho (one semester)  
\*Filosofía can be substituted by Antropología (one semester) in conjunction with TOK for Non Full IB Students (one semester)

## GRADING SYSTEM

Students' grades are based on a percentile with 100 being the top grade awarded and 60 being the lowest passing score. Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate Diploma (IB) courses are weighted (grade x 1.099) with the exception of Theory of Knowledge that is weighted at grade x 1.049. The additional weight is reflected in the cumulative GPA which appears on the transcript. Grades below 70% in any course will not be given additional weight. If a student fails to take the AP or IB exam in May, no additional weight will be given for those courses. The American School Foundation does not rank students. GPA is calculated using only grades from credits earned at ASF; no transfer grades or online course grades are calculated in.
