## General Information

### Description

This course is an exploration of how we acquire knowledge and know what we claim to know. It is not a content-based course, rather an inquiry in how people gather, use, and distribute knowledge within various content area. Each unit includes a focus on the scope of knowledge, perspectives in viewing the knowledge, methods and tools used by knowers, and ethics of knowledge with the specified content area.

### Expectations and Goals

Students should expect to participate in oral discussions on a regular basis. There are typically 2-3 short reading assignments with annotations per week, approximately 2 hours of outside course per week, not including formal assessment. In addition, students will be required to complete the Junior Exhibition and Senior prescribed Essay. There is one formal assessment assignment each semester. This class meets 0 period.
