Dear Parent/Carer

I am so proud of how students, staff and parents have coped with the challenges presented to us this academic year. We have managed, as of today, to stay open to all students and offer a full curriculum.

Year 11 have the toughest challenge of all. Even though it is hard, they have responded really well. Many of them are making rapid progress since returning to school. Our aim for the year group is to get them all onto college, 6th form or apprenticeships with the best possible grades. For some this will mean alternative timetables to be able to achieve their best.

You may be aware that the Government has made some encouraging statements.

- In January schools will be made aware of the topics that will come up in exams to allow for focussed preparation for exams.
- Exams will be marked generously in 2021.
- Exams will start three weeks later to allow more preparation time.
- A system will be put in place to award grades to students who miss exams.

Once we have the full details of this, we will organise another year 11 parents forum.

After Christmas we will putting together extra sessions using the information from the mocks to start targeting gaps in knowledge and support progress to the summer exams. We will also be able to access the national tutoring system to provide additional support in English, Maths and Science. Mock results will be released to students at the end of the first week along with updated forecast grades. You will also get some forecast grades.

We will also be putting on an after school study zone where students can stay and access help and support.

As you are aware, following the government guidance, the last day of term will now be Thursday 17th December. In recognition of year 11s hard work, we will be allowing them an early finish at 1.30pm.

School staff will be working through the start of the holidays to the 23rd December to support track and trace. We may be in touch if there is a positive case.
