Williamsburg Northside School (WNS), a growing co-educational, progressive N-8 institution located in Brooklyn, New York, with an enrollment of just over 360 students, has two campuses: the preschool campus for 2s and 3s and just a few blocks away, the PK-8 campus (<u>willnorth.org</u>). Stemming from the Reggio roots planted in its long-running preschool program, Northside takes a decidedly student-centric approach to learning that puts autonomy, self-discovery, and iterative practice front and center. It blends a robust, project-based environment with the most innovative and proven curricular approaches from around the world. Inspired by its motto, *Aude Quaerere*, dare to ask, Northside is dedicated to sparking a lifelong love of learning, and showcasing that effective collaboration, generosity of spirit, and pure intellectual curiosity not only leads to success but to significance and a greater sense of purpose.

The Position

Williamsburg Northside School seeks a dynamic, innovative, and passionate full-time School Psychologist for the 2020-2021 school year. This full-time, 10-month position is responsible for working with students, teachers, and parents from grades pre-k through eight in helping to address the psychological and developmental needs that arise for students during these years. This role requires the ability to work with multiple administrators and cross-divisionally. Support is also given to families and faculty at the preschool as needed.

Major Duties & Responsibilities

• Direct parent consultation and support regarding childhood development and parenting strategies is provided to problem-solve the needs of individual students and their families, and referrals to outside providers are made when needed or requested.

• Consults with teachers and provides guidance on areas related to student behavior, academic concerns and social emotional development, and conducts classroom and student observations as needed.

• Coordinates outside referrals and collects feedback from outside neuropsychological evaluations.

• Involved in evaluating eligibility for learning and testing accommodations and supporting in concert with the Student Support Team.

- Contribute to and participate in divisional and school-wide health programs.
- Identify and address learning and behavior problems that interfere with school success.

• Maintain student records, including reports of meetings, confidential records, records of services provided, and behavioral data and share these data with appropriate school personnel.

• Promote school policies and practices and respond to crises by providing leadership, direct services, and coordination with school personnel.

• Engage respectfully with families and demonstrate sensitivity to cultures, values, configurations, and beliefs.

• Demonstrate a passion for lifelong learning and actively pursue professional development rooted in individual and schoolwide goals.

• Participate in the school community, including faculty and committee work, and school duties.

• Promote respect for diversity, equity, and inclusion as a core value of the School, a shared responsibility in partnership with the school community.
