

Impact on our Local Community

Each year, around 30 local organisations including charities and sports groups use our facilities. We envisage this number growing when we open our new campus, which will provide facilities not currently available locally, including indoor cricket nets, a recital hall and a large conference hall. We hope to expand our number of partnerships with local state schools, community groups and sports groups, so that more members of the community can benefit from our new facilities.



Our first multi-sports holiday camps will take place in the summer of 2020, to allow children from the wider community to use our new sports facilities.

Building on our heritage OF PHILANTHROPY

The school was founded in 1502 by Sir John Percyvale. A local boy who went on to become Lord Mayor of London, Sir John founded a school in his hometown through an endowment upon his death. Since then, the school has thrived and grown through subsequent gifts and endowments.

Many former pupils choose to pass on the benefits of their education by donating to our Bursary Fund. One in 15 pupils at King's receives some financial assistance and, for those children, their bursary is life-changing.

Gifts that fund facilities for future generations of pupils are given by those who themselves share our vision for a brighter future.

My children both attended King's and received an outstanding education. My


wife Debbie and I have been long-standing supporters of the Bursary Fund. Recently, we have chosen to support the 2020 Vision with a major gift.
