General Considerations for Post-Secondary Planning

Key Family Conversations

- Student Interests, Strengths, and Autonomy
- Family Values/Expectations of post-secondary pursuits
 - Career fulfillment and financial earnings
 - Independence and Maturity / "Adulting"
- Family/Household Expectations and Responsibilities
 - Care-giving to others
 - Proximity--living at home? 1-2 hours away?
 - Financial need--what can family contribute vs. what will be expected of student





Options to consider

- Working full-time
- Apprenticeships/Trades
- Gap Year
- Military
- Community College
- Four-Year College/University

 - Keep in mind some career paths require schooling beyond a four-year degree, while others may not require a four-year degree, but specialized training and experience









- Multicultural Open House Events
 - Offered in Spring and Fall
 - Often family-focused/friendly
 - May advertise special student affinity groups and additional scholarships
- Ongoing, virtual presentations
 - YouTube, Social Media accounts
- College Fairs
- Summer Enrichment or Pre-College Programs
 - May have scholarships available
 - Additional college/career exposure


