

## **Learner Working Abroad During Pandemic**

This Learners Working Abroad During Pandemic policy is effective as of the **{date}** day of **{month}**, **{year}**.

As on-campus educational institutions, CLC Schools (Nea and ACLC) can only offer Distance Learning services during the COVID-19 pandemic to learners residing within reasonable physical commuting distance from the school.

The only exception to this rule are learners who were actively and continuously enrolled at Nea or ACLC during the period leading up to, and during, the COVID-19 pandemic who traveled abroad during a school break and who, due to the pandemic, find themselves unable to return to the area.

Such a learner, seeking to participate in distance learning services while residing abroad, must provide written documentation of the travel restrictions that prevent them from returning to the area.

Federal laws are in place that require learners to be on-campus when distance learning is lifted. Thus, when traditional on-campus learning returns, all learners will be required to return to the school campus or they will be removed from the schools' enrollment. Learners who are returning from abroad will have a grace period of seven school days for travel, and an independent study contract of 14 days to be in quarantine upon their return to the area.

Learners who are attending CLC Schools while overseas during pandemic-required Distance Learning cannot be counted in ADA for government revenue purposes.
