This year, we have had some major challenges, which have impacted our country, state, cities, and sadly our most precious gifts, our children. School did not look the same this year for any student in the world. Many children have suffered both academically and emotionally. However, here at WAY, we have done our best to help keep our students and staff safe. We implemented a 100% virtual learning environment and have worked to keep the same strong relationship with you and your child.

We have sustained our lunch program, purchased phycological supports for both staff and students, and assured all families have reliable technology and internet connectivity. Once our building reopens for attendance, you will find we are well prepared with the necessary COVID-19 personal protective equipment.

On a more positive note, I am excited to announce our Micro School Project is up and running. MICRO SCHOOL is a new service we are providing to all students in grades 6-10. We now can assign certified, highly trained teachers with no more than ten students per class. The classes allow for all four core subjects to be taught in small groups, providing more consistency and support. The sessions are virtual, and teachers meet with students eight times a week. In between sessions, students will have access to additional academic support staff.

Micro School will allow the physical lab to provide more target supports and learning experiences for students. More information on the lab makeover will follow as we get closer to reopening.

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Hello Researchers.

I hope all is well with you and your families as we approach the end of this "interesting" year. With the semester coming to a close, it is vital that we collectively reaffirm our educational goals to continue our success during the next semester and beyond. Below are the minimum requirements for every researcher enrolled at W-A-Y Academy-SW for the remainder of the school year: Log in to HERO and work on projects for at least 4 hours a day, 5 days a week, all year.

- Earn at least 0.125 credits a week and 0.5 (a half) credit each month.
- Message your mentor at least 3 times per week through the method of your choosina.
- Attend Count Day in February and complete all Count Day requirements.

Focusing on these requirements is crucial in progressing toward graduation and developing your professional acumen for future endeavors. Students can fulfill requirements by attending HomeBase with Mr. Schwartz (High School) and Ms. Briana (Middle School).

HomeBase allows students the opportunity to work with Live Sessions teachers for direct guidance in projects, attend Explore sessions to socialize with staff members and engage in fun activities, check-in with assigned mentors, and receive schoolwide updates.
