### MINUTES DAVIE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION TUESDAY, JULY 7, 2020

The Davie County Board of Education met at 4:00 p.m., July 7, 2020, via Zoom due to COVID-19 pandemic restrictions.

Chairman Junker called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

Terry Hales made the motion, seconded by David Carroll, to adopt the agenda as presented. The motion carried 7-0.

Paul Drechsler made the motion, seconded by Lori Smith, to approve the minutes of the June 2, 2020 regular Board of Education meeting as presented. The motion carried 7-0.

### **Board Report**

Chairman Junker reviewed upcoming events which included Board of Commissioner's meetings on July 13 and August 3 at 6:00 p.m. Our next Board of Education meeting will be August 4, 2020 at 4:00 p.m. Prior to the vote about the Early College calendar on the agenda, Early College's start date was August 6, 2020. Davie County School's first day for students will be August 17, 2020.

### Superintendent's Report

Mr. Wallace started his report by stating Governor Cooper's announcement was delayed last week which would have included his decision on how public schools will start in August. Superintendents expect a decision by July 17, which is the same deadline for Phase 2 in North Carolina.

Our staff has worked hard on reopening school plans. Davie County Schools has a link called Safe and Secure Planning for 2020-2021 on the Davie County School's homepage; there are many resources linked there for the community to view.

Through additional surveys sent to parents in our district, almost 50% of parents responded with 70% feeling comfortable about sending their children back to school, while 30% do not feel comfortable.

Our main goal is to have children back in school. Mr. Wallace explained what Plan B will most likely look like if the Governor chooses that plan for our students for the start of school. Davie County Schools has chosen an A/B day schedule. The A group would attend school on Mondays and Thursdays, B group would attend school Tuesdays and Fridays with Wednesdays being a remote learning day for all. The remote learning day will be a day for extra cleaning in the schools. Most likely, Davie County Schools will choose who is in the A or B groups by bus routes instead of alphabetically, etc. Due to possibly being on Plan B for the start of school, we could have to run multiple bus routes each day which could impact start times of our schools. With the increased bus runs, there would be an increase in cost of about \$350,000 for buses to complete their routes for the 2020-2021 school year.

Elementary principals are currently determining a plan to have all students in grades K-2 in the school building all 4 days with Wednesdays still being a remote learning day for those students. This plan will be finalized on July 8, 2020 and the information will be sent to parents on July 9, 2020. There will be a virtual option for those families who do not feel comfortable sending their child to school or are immuno-compromised/high risk. Brittany Holland is in charge of leading the virtual option and more details will be released at a later date. There are still many questions and details to be worked out but Davie County Schools must wait for guidance from the Governor, DHHS, CDC, and our local health department to help determine best practices while dealing with COVID-19 changes.

Teachers will have mandatory trainings closer to school starting along with ongoing professional development to make sure Davie County Schools is giving teachers the best training so our students can be proficient and excel with online learning and new school schedules no matter what plan we are in during the school year. Remote learning will not look like it did for the end of the 2019-2020 school year; students will be held accountable and attendance will be a factor.

Mr. Wallace stated that all 2,500 of the newly purchased chrome books are in the technology department getting ready for students. Davie County Schools is prepared to be 1:1 for grades 6-12. We will need to address no/low connectivity issues by providing paper packets and additional internet access in our parking lots. Our remote instructional plan is due to the state on July 20, 2020. Davie County Schools has chosen Canvas as our learning management system that will be used for K-12. We will also use SeeSaw for grades K-5.

On June 15, 2020 NCHSAA lifted the ban on athletes practicing their sport. Mike Absher worked with staff members and Davie County's DHHS Director, Suzanne Wright, to determine safe plans for practices. There is no playing catch for baseball players and no passes to other players in football as sports balls cannot be shared per NCHSAA. Mr. Wallace was happy to report fields opened at 6:30 a.m. for those practices and our students showed up eager to participate.

Mr. Wallace congratulated George Sulecki and the School Nutrition staff for serving 371,000 meals to children March 17-June 15, 2020. The summer feeding program is currently happening at 3 schools and 30 drop-off sites. Hazel Marion was recognized for being a member of the All State Honor Band for the 2019-2020 school year. Hazel was 7<sup>th</sup> chair flute and is a rising sophomore at Davie High School. Davie High School's Future Farmers of America chapter was recognized as a National Chapter Finalist-Gold Level during the NC FFA virtual celebration June 16-18, 2020. Bailey Dyson from DCHS FFA received 1<sup>st</sup> place in the state for Diversified Livestock Production. Hunter Leroy earned the Old North State FFA Degree and the DEKALB Agricultural Accomplishment Award.

### Consent Agenda

David Carroll made the motion, seconded by Lori Smith, to approve the consent items as presented. The motion carried 7-0. Consent items approved: Budget Amendment 2019-2020, Donations Report, Revised School Nutrition Procurement Plan, and Personnel Recommendations. After the approval of the consent items, Jinda Haynes spoke to introduce new and newly appointed administration staff on the personnel report. Michael Pruitt is now the Principal at North Davie Middle School. Angela Burgess is now the Principal at Cooleemee Elementary School. Wendy Maglio is now an Assistant Principal at Davie County High School. Demario Reid is new to the county and is an Assistant Principal at Davie County High School.

### **Business items**

Mrs. Jinda Haynes presented a revised Early College High School calendar that aligns with new legislation due to COVID-19. Paul Drechsler made the motion, seconded by David Carroll to approve the revised Early College High School calendar for 2020-2021. The motion carried 7-0.

Mr. Wallace presented the policies for approval that we presented for review at the June 2, 2020 board of education meeting. Dub Potts made the motion, seconded by Wendy Horne to approve the policies as presented. The motion carried 7-0.

### Staff Reports

Mr. Wallace presented policies given to board members so they can review them during the month of July. These policy updates will be presented for approval in August at the regular board of education meeting on August 4, 2020.

Mrs. Jennifer Lynde presented information about Summer Learning. Davie County Schools is offering the following:

- A partnership with Imprints Cares for rising 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> graders providing face-to-face academic and enrichment opportunities at Cornatzer Elementary and Cooleemee Elementary.
- Virtual reading instruction for rising 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> graders.
- Virtual math instruction for rising 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> graders.
- Virtual math instruction for 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade students and Math 1-3.

The state required a Summer Learning/Jump Start and Remediation Plan for each district in order to receive funds to support rising 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> graders in both reading and math. However, 50% of the funds must be used for rising 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade students for reading support. Secondary teachers and school leadership expressed a need for math support for students in grades 6-11. Davie County Schools has put a plan in place to address this need and will use federal CARES Act funds to provide this support.

Mr. Michael Spillman presented information on K Building. K Building is 30,000 square feet and has 5 acres of land. The tax value of the property is \$3.5 million. Previously calculated renovation costs for only 22,000 square feet equals \$3.5 million while the county only has \$1.5 million budgeted to renovate. It costs Davie County Schools \$25,000 per year to keep K Building and the property.

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In order to consolidate County Office and Central Davie Education Center administration staff, a building of 15,000-18,000 square feet would be needed. School Nutrition would stay at the CDEC administration building. County Office building would no longer be used. This plan will still be discussed and further cost estimations will be presented at future board of education meetings.

### Public Address to the Board

None.

### **Closed Session**

Chairman Junker called for a motion to go into closed session to preserve the attorney client privilege pursuant to the North Carolina General Statues listed on the agenda, to review matters protected by State Law and to discuss student concerns made confidential by General Statutes and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Dub Potts made the motion, seconded by Lori Smith; the motion carried 7-0. The board went into closed session at 5:29 p.m.

David Carroll left the meeting at 6:03 p.m. The board came out of closed session at 6:05 p.m. After the board members came out of closed session, Jill Wilson stated that the board wanted to extend Mr. Wallace's contract to June 30, 2024 and give him \$5,000 to put in a retirement account to honor and award him for his great leadership during the COVID-19 pandemic. Lori Smith made the motion, Dub Potts seconded to approve the contract extension and \$5,000 to a retirement account for Mr. Jeff Wallace. The motion carried 6-0. Mr. Junker stated David Carroll was in full support of this decision.

### Adjourn

Lori Smith made the motion to adjourn with a second from Wendy Horne; the motion was approved with a 6-0 vote. The meeting adjourned at 6:08 p.m.

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### DAVIE COUNTY SCHOOLS PROCUREMENT PLAN SCHOOL NUTRITION PROGRAM

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The procurement plan described on the following pages (pages 1 through 25) was adopted by the Davie County Board of Education (BOE) and will be implemented effective February 1, 2018 and from that date forward until amended. All procurement processes and activities will be consistent with the principles of free and open competition. The SFA will avoid unreasonable conditions that restrict competition. All reasonable efforts will be made to solicit bids, proposals and/or quotes from as many qualified vendors as possible; all qualified vendors are invited to respond to solicitations.

The procurement of all goods and services using School Nutrition funds will be carefully documented during each phase of the procurement process. The BOE shall award contracts to responsible contractors possessing the ability to perform successfully under the terms and conditions of the proposed solicitation. The BOE will restrict awards, sub-awards and contracts with any party that is debarred, suspended or otherwise excluded from participation in Federal assistance programs or activities. All parties involved in the procurement process involving School Nutrition funds will comply with a written code of ethics/conduct, which includes a conflict of interest policy. Adherence with the code of ethics/conduct and conflict of interest policies is fundamental to the integrity of the procurement process.


