

MINUTES
DAVIE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION
TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 13, 2018

The Davie County Board of Education met at 6:00pm, November 13, 2018, in the Board Room of the Central Davie Education Center, 220 Martin Luther King Jr. Road, Mocksville, NC.

Chairman Junker called the meeting to order at 5:20pm.

Barbara Owens made the motion, seconded by Chad Fuller, to adopt the agenda as presented. The motion carried 7-0.

Chairman Junker called for a motion to go into closed session to preserve the attorney client privilege pursuant to the North Carolina General Statutes listed on the agenda, to review matters protected by State Law and to discuss student concerns made confidential by General Statutes and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Chad Fuller made the motion, seconded by Terry Hales; the motion carried 7-0. The Board went into closed session at 5:25pm.

Chairman Junker reconvened the meeting at 6:00pm and offered the invocation. Scout Pack 574 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Barbara Owens made the motion, seconded by Terry Hales, to approve the minutes of the October 2, 2018 regular Board of Education meeting and the October 25, 2018 Special Called Board of Education meeting as presented. The motion carried 7-0.

Board Report

Chairman Junker reviewed upcoming events, reminding Board members of the Stars Banquet on Thursday, November 15, 2018. Mr. Junker announced the next regular scheduled meeting of the Board of Education will be Tuesday, December 4, 2018 at 6:00pm. Mr. Junker then reviewed the proposed

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schedule for the Davie County Board of Education meetings in 2019. Terry Hales made a motion to adopt the proposed dates; Barbara Owens provided the second. The motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Hartness began his monthly report by congratulating Clint Junker, Lori Smith, and David Carroll on their election to the Davie County Board of Education. Dr. Hartness also thanked outgoing Board members, Chad Fuller and Barbara Owens, for their decade of dedicated service to the Board.

Dr. Hartness reported on the interesting events taking place around the district during the past month including: the opening of War Eagle Credit Union at Davie County High School; the visit of Lieutenant Governor Dan Forest, North Carolina Senator Dan Barrett, and North Carolina Representative Julia Howard to Cooleemee Elementary School as the school was recognized for being in the top four percent in North Carolina in academic growth; and lastly the many wonderful Veterans Day celebrations around the district.

The Superintendent informed the Board that Chief Finance Officer Deborah Miller would be leaving to return to her hometown in Pennsylvania at the end of the month. Dr. Hartness expounded on the efficiency, professionalism, and diligence of Ms. Miller, even during difficult times. Ms. Miller will be missed, but the Superintendent expressed his confidence in the interim CFO, Mrs. Tammy Naylor until a permanent replacement is hired.

The Superintendent ended his narrative by wishing all students, staff, and Board members a Happy Thanksgiving and reminding everyone of how much we have to be thankful for in Davie County.

Recognitions

Dr. Hartness recognized Brittany Holland, Assistant Principal at William R. Davie Elementary School, for being selected as the 2018-2019 North Carolina National Outstanding Assistant Principal of the Year. Mrs. Holland will be recognized at the state level during the NCPAPA ceremony in Raleigh in early 2019 and will then attend the national conference in Spokane, Washington in the summer of 2019.

Jeff Wallace recognized the William Ellis Middle School volleyball team. This team won their conference and also had a perfect record, remaining undefeated for the second year in a row.

Mr. Wallace also recognized the Davie County High School varsity volleyball team for their CPC Conference Championship, eighteen game winning streak, CPC Tournament Championship, and overall tremendous 2018 volleyball season.

Consent Agenda

Wendy Horne made the motion, seconded by Chad Fuller, to approve the consent items as presented. The motion carried 7-0. Consent items approved: Budget Amendments, Donations Report, Parent Advisory Council - additional nominations, and Personnel Recommendations.

Business items

Chairman Junker discussed the need for an interim superintendent for Davie County Schools to begin January 1, 2019 until a permanent hire can be made in the spring. Chad Fuller made the motion to hire

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Dr. William Steed for the position of interim superintendent starting January 1, 2019. Dub Potts provided the second. The motion carried 7-0.

Dr. Hartness explained to the Board on September 16, 1998 the Davie County Board of Education entered into a lease agreement with the Town of Cooleemee for a small area on the backside of the Cooleemee Elementary School property. This area is approximately 100 feet by 100 feet. The property is used for a basketball court for the Hickory Street community. The Town of Cooleemee maintains the property and provides adequate liability insurance. The original lease was for twenty years and expired in September, 2018. The town of Cooleemee has requested to renew the lease for five years at \$20 per year. Dub Potts made the motion to extend the lease agreement with the Town of Cooleemee; Barbara Owens seconded the motion. The motion passed 7-0.

Child Nutrition Director George Sulecki presented to the Board the need to terminate the current contract with Sysco, Charlotte. Mr. Sulecki described the issues over the summer between the Foothills Co-op which includes Davie County, Yadkin County, Surry County, Stokes County, Mount Airy and Alexander County and Sysco. For the 2018-2019 school year Sysco was the lowest responsive bidder and had a contract approved by the Board at the July 10, 2018 Board meeting. Since the beginning of the current school year the Foothills Co-op has experienced multiple performance issues that have impacted each of the programs within the co-op. The co-op has met with Sysco and provided appropriate time to correct their performance issues, but they have failed to do so. The co-op has agreed, with Board permission, to terminate the contract with Sysco and award the contract to the next lowest bidder. Barbara Owens made the motion to terminate the contract with Sysco and award the contract to US Foods, Fort Mill. Terry Hales seconded the motion. The motion carried 7-0.

Michael Spillman described the major compressor failure of the chiller at Cornatzer Elementary School. Staff contracted Consulting Engineering Services to consult and write the specifications to replace the chiller. Prices were requested from Trane, Carrier, and Daiken directly. Bids were opened and accepted on October 9, 2018. Chad Fuller made the motion to approve the purchase of a 140 ton Daiken chiller from Hoffman and Hoffman with additional expenses including sales tax and a consulting fee for a total budget of \$102,600. Terry Hales seconded the motion; the motion carried 7-0.

Michael Spillman then explained the need to for the Board to approve a contract for the installation of the chiller at Cornatzer Elementary School. Mr. Spillman described to the Board the process of the mandatory pre-bid meeting that was held on October 31, 2018. Professional Air Systems, Associated Heating and Air Conditioning and Commercial Air Systems attended. Chad Fuller made the motion to accept the bid from Associated Heating & Air Conditioning with Alternate 1 for a total budget of \$38,400 to install the chiller. Terry Hales provided the second. The motion passed 7-0.

Mr. Spillman then informed the Board that the main water heaters at Cornatzer Elementary School must be replaced. He explained Davie County Schools accepted quotes from four vendors last year when replacing the heaters at William Ellis Middle School. Taking warranty, reliability, maintenance and price into consideration, Mr. Spillman recommended the purchase two PVI water heaters from Thermal Resource Sales in the total amount of \$60,614. Paul Drechsler made the motion to approved Mr. Spillman's recommendation. Chad Fuller seconded the motion. The motion carried 7-0.

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Deborah Miller presented to the Board the need for new hand held radios at our three middle schools. Chief Technology Officer Butch Rooney answered questions about the requirement for this technology to meet FCC regulations. Paul Drechsler made the motion to approve \$20,000 of capital outlay funds to provide hand radios and supporting equipment to Davie County Schools' middle schools. Wendy Horne provided the second. The motion passed 7-0.

Deborah Miller presented the Public School Building Capital Fund – Lottery Funds Application to the Board. Ms. Miller brought this application for Board approval to cover the expenses related to the chiller replacement. Barbara Owens made the motion to accept the Lottery Funds Application. Terry Hales seconded the motion; the motion carried 7-0.

Deborah Miller then presented to the Board the necessary capital outlay budget amendment for the expenses related to purchase of hand radios for our middle schools and the water heaters at Cornatzer. Terry Hales made the motion to approve the capital outlay budget amendment. Paul Drechsler seconded the motion. The motion passed 7-0.

Public Address to the Board

None.

Committee and Staff Reports

CTE Director Anthony Davis presented to the Board on the success of the 2018 Manufacturing Day. He explained Davie County Schools, local businesses, and the Chamber of Commerce partnered to provide a unique opportunity for approximately 470 eighth grade students. On October 5th, students from William Ellis, North Davie, and South Davie Middle Schools toured different locations including DEX Heavy Duty Parts, Gildan, Ingersoll Rand, Pro Refrigeration, DCCC – Davie Campus, and WFBH-Davie Medical Center – Bermuda Run. Other students from all three schools spent their tour-time experiencing many different facets of Ashley Furniture Industries, Inc. Business leaders provided informative tours including examples of how their employees use math, science, technology and communication skills.

Jinda Haynes, Jeff Jones, and Amanda Beck presented a new program to the Board that was created in partnership between the Davie County Sheriff's Department and Davie County Schools, Empower DC. Empower DC with Project Alert lessons is a shift away from the 5th grade D.A.R.E. program and would instead focus on 6th grade students in strengthening confidence, work on pressure resistance, and also educate students on drug awareness. The team explained this program was timely, updated, and focused on building relationships. Not only are SROs involved, but also teachers – providing specific lessons and controlled creative experiences for students to practice what they learn. The Board, district leaders, principals, and teachers are excited about this important opportunity for Davie County Schools' 6th grade students to gain the skills and knowledge they need to navigate their futures.

Michael Spillman presented to the Board the final stages of construction of the new Davie County High School field house. Mr. Spillman provided pictures of the newly finished tile, lighting, the coaches' conference room, grass, and fencing. Mr. Spillman invited the Board to attend a tour of the field house on Wednesday December 5, 2018.

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
Erin Foil presented to the Board the remaining data elements of the new Every Student Succeeds Act - accountability plan, including: growth data for subgroups, school performance grades, and federal designations for schools in the state based on accountability data.

Mrs. Foil then presented newly released ACT and SAT local, state, and national data to the Board. Davie County Schools is ranked 3rd in the Piedmont-Triad region and 17th out of 115 school districts in the state in ACT scores. Davie County Schools is ranked 2nd in the Piedmont-Triad region and 16th out of 115 school districts in the state in SAT scores. The Board and district leaders were very proud of our students, but also very proud of DCS' teachers, at all levels, for making sure Davie County Schools' students are college and career ready.


Lastly, Dr. Hartness explained to the Board that they had received a number of policies to review. The superintendent asked the Board to consider adopting these policies at the December 4, 2018 Board meeting.

Adjourn

Dub Potts made the motion to adjourn with a second from Paul Drechsler; the motion was approved with a 7-0 vote. The meeting adjourned at 7:45pm.

CONTRACT

This contract between the Davie County School Board, party of the first part and the Town of Cooleemee, party of the second part as follows, viz:

1. The party of the first part shall lease to the party of the second part for a period of twenty years the outlined area as attached hereto and incorporated herein of Tax Map M-5-16 D. Said dimensions being approximately 100 feet x 100 feet.
2. The lease amount shall be for \$20.00 the first year payable not later than January 15th each year. Option to renew for five years at end of lease period by mutual consent.
3. Said area shall be used for recreational family purposes only with no enclosed buildings permitted on said premises nor permanent structures of any sort except for jointly used basketball court.
4. The party of the second part shall keep and maintain adequate insurance on said premise and shall hold the lessors free and harmless of any and all liability from the use of said leased premises.
