

MINUTES
DAVIE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION
TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2018

The Davie County Board of Education met at 6:00pm, September 11, 2018, in the Board Room of the Central Davie Education Center, 220 Martin Luther King Jr. Road, Mocksville, NC.

Chairman Junker called the meeting to order at 5:15pm.

Chad Fuller made the motion, seconded by Barbara Owens, to adopt the agenda as presented. The motion carried 7-0.

Chairman Junker called for a motion to go into closed session to preserve the attorney client privilege pursuant to the North Carolina General Statutes listed on the agenda, to review matters protected by State Law and to discuss student concerns made confidential by General Statutes and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Wendy Horne made the motion, seconded by Paul Drechsler; the motion carried 7-0. The Board went into closed session at 5:05pm. Vice-Chair Wendy Horne left the meeting after closed session ended to attend an event at Davie High.

Chairman Junker reconvened the meeting at 6:00pm and offered the invocation. Girl Scouts Troop 2150 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Paul Drechsler made the motion, seconded by Chad Fuller, to approve the minutes of the August 7, 2018 regular Board of Education meeting as presented. The motion carried 6-0.

Board Report

Chairman Junker reviewed upcoming events, reminding Board members of the NCSBA District 5 meeting on September 19, 2018 hosted at Davie County High School. Mr. Junker announced the next regular scheduled meeting of the Board of Education will be Tuesday, October 2, 2018 at 6:00pm.

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Hartness began his monthly report by asking for a moment of silence in honor of the anniversary of September 11, 2001. Dr. Hartness then expounded on the smooth start to the 2018-2019 school year. The Superintendent informed the Board that Davie County Schools has received two school safety grants and have applied for a third. The awarded grants have allowed Davie County Schools to hire two additional School Resource Officers, a new social worker, and will hopefully allow additional trauma informed schools training to teachers and staff in partnership with the Dragonfly House. The Dragonfly House was also instrumental in receiving funding as part of the Governor's Crime Commission grant in which two additional full time mental health therapists will be working within Davie County Schools during the 2018-2019 school year.

Dr. Hartness explained that Davie County was planning a local emergency management officials meeting for the following morning and that shared information and planning as well as updated weather forecasts regarding Hurricane Florence would help determine decisions for the remainder of the week. The Superintendent announced that any changes to the school schedule would be communicated following regular procedures for inclement weather.

Recognitions

Jinda Haynes recognized Davie County High School seniors Sierra Foster and Olivia Jones and Davie County Early College High School senior China Moore who were selected to attend North Carolina Governor's School this past summer.

South Davie Assistant Principal Chelsea Rutledge recognized eighth grade student, Lauren Warlick for her North Carolina Soil and Water Conservation Speech Contest Award.

Consent Agenda

Barbara Owens made the motion, seconded by Terry Hales, to approve the consent items as presented. The motion carried 6-0. Consent items approved: Alternative School Accountability Model Participation, Advisory Council Nominations, Capital Outlay Budget Amendment, Donations Report, Elaine Crummett Contract, Growing to Know Contract, My Net LLC Wallace Communications Contract, Personnel Recommendations, and NCPK Contract Amendments.

Business items

Jeff Wallace presented changes to the YVEDDI – Transportation Contract that had originally been approved in August, 2018. YVEDDI had since contacted Davie County Schools about price restructuring. Mr. Wallace explained the changes and the expected price increase per mile. Paul Drechsler made the motion to approve the new YVEDDI Transportation Contract as presented. Chad Fuller provided the second; the motion carried 6-0.

Jeff Wallace also presented the YVEDDI – Monitoring Services Agreement. The agreement for monitoring services addresses the need for an adult to be on the van to assist and supervise the safe transport of students with handicaps and disabilities. Based on the new contract, the monitor's salary increased from the previous school year's contract. Barbara Owens made the motion to approve the YVEDDI Monitoring Services Agreement. Terry Hales seconded the motion. The motion carried 6-0.

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Dr. Hartness presented an easement to the Board relating to the remaining property at the old Davie High School site allowing the County of Davie to access their property from the previous bus parking area. The superintendent explained how this detail was not included in the original property transfer agreement and had been requested by the County. Chad Fuller made the motion, seconded by Paul Drechsler to approve the easement as presented. The motion carried 6-0.

Dr. Hartness asked the Board to authorize staff to enter into an SRO agreement with the Davie County Sheriff's Department to hire and train additional School Resource Officers for Davie County Schools made possible by one of the newly awarded school safety grants. Barbara Owens made the motion with a second from Paul Drechsler. The motion carried 6-0. Superintendent Hartness and Chairman Junker both stated how grateful they are for the great relationship between Davie County Schools and local law enforcement.

Public Address to the Board

None.

Committee and Staff Reports

Jennifer Lynde presented a detailed report of the K-2 benchmark data results for the 2017-2018 school year. Mrs. Lynde explained changes that will be made to K-2 curriculum and testing with new assessment kits and new testing procedures for the 2018-2019 school year.

Jinda Haynes and Jennifer Lynde presented a summary of the 2018 Read to Achieve Summer Camp. A total of 121 total students were served as part of this camp. Mrs. Haynes explained that over 85% of the seventy-six third grade students who participated in the camp demonstrated growth on the iREADY assessment, mClass assessment, and/or on the Read to Achieve state test. Jinda was thankful for the partnership of the Mocksville YMCA and the Mocksville Public Library in helping to make the Read to Achieve Summer Camp fun as well as instructive.

Jinda Haynes, Jennifer Lynde, and Peggy Nuckolls shared with the Board updates from year one of the five year DavieLEADS plan, including accomplishments, challenges, and next steps. The group explained that much of year one was building data, driving instruction, and emphasizing differentiation. By already strengthening instructional practices and updating resources and materials, improvement in scores was already evident in the 2017-2018 school year. Jinda thanked the Mebane Foundation for their commitment in making this new vision for the future of Davie County Schools possible.

John Marshall presented information to the Board about the 2018 STEM Pipeline Camp. This sixth annual camp was organized and funded through a Davie Community Foundation Grant. Twenty-nine seventh and eighth grade students attended. Students engaged in problem based learning, worked to respond to complex questions, and created high quality products and digital media presentations.

Anthony Davis shared with the Board the successes of the Externship Program. Mr. Davis explained that several educators from Davie County High School, as part of a larger community group, were able to tour local businesses within our area to really experience different jobs and understand what the required skills of the workforce were for different industries. Anthony described how this information will be invaluable for our teachers as they are advising students of career possibilities after graduation.

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Erin Foil presented Davie County Schools' ten day enrollment numbers (6,128) and the 2017-2018 Accountability and Student Information – Results. Mrs. Foil gave an overview of School Performance Grades, Proficiency (Grade Level Proficiency and College and Career Ready), Growth, and the long term goals established in North Carolina.


George Sulecki presented the results from the 2018 Summer Food Service Program. The Food Service Program was operated from July 18, 2018 to August 10, 2018 for a total of 39 days. 7,147 breakfast meals were served and 16,433 lunch meals were served for a total of 23,580 meals.

Deborah Miller gave an update on the Davie County High School Construction Budget. Ms. Miller stated that Davie County Schools has spent 99% of allocated bond and lottery funds. The last remaining projects at Davie High are finishing the field house and building the concession stand/restroom facility.

Michael Spillman gave a presentation to the Board on the construction progress of the new Davie County High School Field House. Mr. Spillman informed the Board of recent headway with installing air conditioners, pouring concrete, and working on getting the roof shingled. Mr. Spillman shared the Field House is expected to be complete by the end of September.

Adjourn

Dub Potts made the motion to adjourn with a second from Chad Fuller; the motion was approved with a 6-0 vote. The meeting adjourned at 7:50pm.
