Chairman Junker called the meeting to order at 5:15pm.

Paul Drechsler made the motion, seconded by Lori Smith, to adopt the agenda as presented. The motion carried 7-0.

Chairman Junker called for a motion to go into closed session to preserve the attorney client privilege pursuant to the North Carolina General Statutes listed on the agenda, to review matters protected by State Law, and to discuss student concerns made confidential by General Statutes and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. David Carroll made the motion, seconded by Terry Hales; the motion carried 7-0. The Board went into closed session at 5:17pm.

Chairman Junker reconvened the meeting at 6:01pm and offered the invocation. Members from Scout Troop 30075 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

David Carroll made the motion, seconded by Terry Hales, to approve the minutes of the January 7, 2020 regular board of education meeting as presented. The motion carried 7-0.

Superintendent's Report

Mr. Wallace started by thanking veteran administrators, Rex Allen and Candy Poplin, who have covered schools where an administrator had to take time off from work.

On January 23, Mr. Wallace and staff met with the board of commissioners to present an update on Davie County Schools. Mr. Wallace commended the County of Davie staff for a pleasant meeting and appreciated Clint Junker and Wendy Horne attending as well. As part of the presentation to the board of commissioners, an info graph was handed out with data and facts about Davie County Schools. This was shared with the board of education members tonight.

The Davie County district staff will be presenting at the March 2 board of commissioners meeting with an update on Davie County Schools.

As part of House Bill 75, Part V, Mr. Wallace is required to report school mental health support personnel numbers to the local board of education no later than February 15, 2020. The report requires the total number of each category of school mental health support personnel employed in the unit and the different from the previous school year in the total number of each category. In 2018-2019, Davie County Schools had the following number of counselors: 6 elementary, 3 middle, 4 high, 1 Central Davie Academy, and 1 at Early College High School. There were 4 social workers, 7 nurses, and 1 full time psychologist and 1 contract psychologist. In 2019-2020, Davie County Schools have the following number of counselors: 6 elementary, 3 middle, 4 high, 1 Central Davie Academy, and 1 Early College High School. There were 3 social workers but a grant added back the 4th social worker in November of 2019. There are still 7 nurses and now 2 full time psychologists.

Recognitions

Mrs. Jinda Haynes recognized 3 staff members who recently earned their National Board Certifications. Erin Brown from DCHS, Gloria Chalmers from SDMS, and Suzie Hecht from MES were presented certificates for their accomplishment. A list of all staff currently working as teachers who have their National Board Certificates was presented celebrating their success as well.

Mr. Wallace recognized two schools that had excellent growth for the 2018-2019 school year per the NC School Report Card. Mocksville Elementary School was in the top 5% of elementary schools in the state for math growth. Mrs. Jennifer Swofford, principal, accepted the certificate on the school's behalf. William Ellis Middle School was 12th highest in the state of NC for overall growth out of over 2500 schools for 2018-2019. Mrs. Cindy Myers accepted the certificate on the school's behalf.

Committee and Staff Reports

Mrs. Jinda Haynes presented the Early College High School calendar for the 2020-2021 school year. The proposed calendar will be presented for approval at the March 3, 2020 board of education meeting.

Mr. Clay Harris presented the quarterly update on the year-to-date spending and revenue for all funds.

Mrs. Jennifer Custer and Mrs. Lori Dingler presented the NC Annual School Health Services Report. Mrs. Dingler stated the 7 nurses in the school district meet with students on a regular basis and deliver the best plan of care for asthma, diabetes, mental/behavior health, seizures, and severe allergy students.

Last year, Davie County Schools had 39 diabetic students, performed 3,124 vision screenings, had 368 staff members that were seen by a nurse, had 990 students that were given medication and 89 staff members that were trained in CPR/AED usage/Epipen usage/Stop the Bleed. There were 14,282 students seen in the nurses offices in the county and 13,294 were sent back to class. The nurses have seen an increase in chronic health conditions in students. The nurse to student ratio for North Carolina is 1:1,021. For Davie County Schools, it is 1:873. The guidelines for nurse to student ratio is 1:750. We are above the guidelines but below the state average for the ratio.
