TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 2019

The Davie County Board of Education met at 6:00pm, September 10, 2019, in the Board Room of the Central Davie Education Center, 220 Martin Luther King Jr. Road, Mocksville, NC.

Chairman Junker called the meeting to order at 5:15pm.

Dub Potts made the motion, seconded by Terry Hales, to adopt the agenda as presented. Mr. Wallace stated there had been a last minute change to the Other Special Revenue Fund Amendment attachment in BoardDocs. There was a column that did not add up correctly but it had been corrected and uploaded into BoardDocs for the Board of Education to view. The motion carried 6-0.

Chairman Junker called for a motion to go into closed session to preserve the attorney client privilege pursuant to the North Carolina General Statutes listed on the agenda, to review matters protected by State Law, and to discuss student concerns made confidential by General Statutes and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Lori Smith made the motion, seconded by Wendy Horne; the motion carried 6-0. The Board went into closed session at 5:18pm

Chairman Junker reconvened the meeting at 6:01pm and offered the invocation. Chairman Junker led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Terry Hales made the motion, seconded by David Carroll, to approve the minutes of the August 6, 2019 regular Board of Education meeting as presented. The motion carried 6-0.

Board Report

Chairman Junker reviewed upcoming events, reminding Board members of the NCSBA District 5 meeting on September 18, 2019 hosted at Thomasville High School from 4:00-8:00pm. The Board of Education will start their school lunches on September 27, 2019 at 11:30am at Shady Grove Elementary School. Mr. Junker announced the next regular scheduled meeting of the Board of Education will be Tuesday, October 1, 2019 at 6:00pm.

Superintendent's Report

Mr. Wallace began his monthly report with a moment of silence in memory of Olivia Huff; Olivia was a Senior at Davie County High School this year who had been battling leukemia.

Mr. Wallace spoke about convocation this year being on the first workday for staff, August 20, 2019. August 28, 2019 was the first day of school for students. Mr. Wallace thanked the maintenance staff, custodians, and all those who had a hand in preparing the schools for the first day.

Mr. Wallace gave an update on Istation. Our staff was trained on Istation with the first assessment being held at Cooleemee Elementary School on September 10, 2019. The NC Department of Information Technology has put a stay on the rollout of Istation but NCDPI directed LEAs to continue training until this matter is resolved. In addition to using Istation, teachers will continue to use mCLASS, an assessment tool that has been used since 2013. Jennifer Lynde worked with the Mebane Foundation to secure funding for mCLASS for another year.

Mr. Wallace explained the 10 day enrollment numbers. The expected enrollment number of students was 6133; the current enrollment is 6088. Mr. Wallace commended Erin Foil and her team, along with the school principals and data managers on having 92% of students registered in PowerSchool prior to the start of school. Davie County Schools offered times where a computer lab was available for parents to come and complete the enrollment process online, this included some Saturdays as well.

Lastly, Mr. Wallace informed the Board of Education that the County Office staff volunteered to work concessions for the September 6, 2019 Davie County High School football game vs Mooresville High School.

Recognitions

Cherri White recognized Davie County High School students Parker Prysiazniuk and Connor Robertson for being selected to attend North Carolina Governor's School this past summer.

Anthony Davis recognized Family and Consumer Science teacher, Sandra Hinkle, for competing and placing 1st place at the National Restaurant Association Educational Foundation Summer Institute.

Mr. Wallace recognized Jeremy Miller and the Transportation Department for getting the lowest bus inspection score in the Central Region and the lowest overall inspection score for the State of North Carolina in 2018-2019. DCS Transportation Department had the best score in North Carolina.

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Consent Agenda

Mrs. Jinda Haynes interjected Mr. Junker when he asked for a motion to approve the consent items stating an addendum to the personnel report was added in BoardDocs. Mrs. Haynes passed out paper copies of said addendum. Wendy Horne made the motion, seconded by Terry Hales, to approve the consent items as presented. The motion carried 6-0. Consent items approved: Advisory Council Nominations, Other Special Revenue Budget Amendment, Capital Outlay Fund Budget Amendment, Donations Report, Yadtel Contract, Personnel Recommendations, and a Personnel Recommendations addendum.

Business Items

Mr. Clay Harris presented, for information only, the amendment to Policy 6450 which took out the conflicting policy contract limit amount that the Board of Education must approve of. The adjusted Policy 6450 was given to the Board of Education to review so it can be voted on at the October 1, 2019 Board of Education meeting.

Mr. Michael Spillman presented bids for the approved walkway cover projects for Mocksville Elementary School, Pinebrook Elementary School, Shady Grove Elementary School, and the relocation of the multi-room mobile POD to South Davie Middle School. Mr. Spillman and staff recommended contracting with Jim's Custom Windows for the amount of \$73,000.00. Dub Potts made the motion to approve the bid contract with Jim's Custom Windows for the amount of \$73,000, Lori Smith seconded it. The motion carried 6-0.

Mr. Michael Spillman presented bids for the roof replacement at the Davie County Schools Administrative Office at 220 Cherry Street, Mocksville NC 27028. Mr. Spillman and staff recommended contracting with Hillsdale Roofing in the amount of \$47,685.00. Terry Hales made the motion to approve the bid from Hillsdale Roofing in the amount of \$47,685.00, Dub Potts seconded it. The motion carried 6-0.

Mrs. Jennifer Lynde presented the contract with Growing to Know in the amount of \$102,800.00. This is year three of a DavieLeads grant to provide these services. Wendy Horne made the motion to approve the Growing to Know contract for \$102,800.00, Terry Hales seconded it. The motion carried 6-0.

Public Address to the Board

None.

Committee and Staff Reports

The Operations Team started by presenting updates in each of their departments. Mr. George Sulecki, Child Nutrition Director, started with updates on the summer feeding program. The summer feeding program ran from June 17, 2019 to August 9, 2019. Child Nutrition was able to employ 17 people and have 27 total sites where food was available. Out of those 27 sites, 5 were school sites and 22 were bus stops they would go to and deliver food. A total of 28, 255 meals were served; which comes to 725 meals per day.

Mr. Butch Rooney explained with his technology update that all computers in the district were cleaned and serviced. New projector lamps and desktop computers were placed in each K-5 classroom for a total of 214 lamps/computers installed. The technology team completed the last year of a 4-year network upgrade at South Davie Middle School. Mr. Rooney stated from July 1, 2018 to September 6, 2019 4,199 work orders were opened and 4,189 of those have been closed.

Mr. Michael Spillman presented the facility maintenance update starting with the move of the mobile POD from the old Davie County High School campus to South Davie Middle School. Brick was donated for the undershirt of the mobile POD and the DCHS masonry class will complete the project. A walkway, which was voted on this night, will be attached to the mobile POD for those students and a key card reader will be on the POD like any other school building. The maintenance department updated floors at William R Davie Elementary School, HVAC units at Mocksville Elementary and William R Davie Elementary, built a 3-5 grade classroom with a restroom and "cool-down" room at Central Davie Academy, along with a new bored well at Davie County High School for irrigation purposes. Mr. Spillman also stated SafeSchools training is online now so employees can watch the yearly required videos on their time by a deadline.


Mr. Jeremy Miller presented updates with the transportation department. He started with the upgrade of Synovia, which is the tracking system used on all school buses. They now will be using a newer tablet in the bus to track its every move and if needed an alert can be sent to the bus letting the driver know they need to pull over and call the school.

Mr. John Marshall and Mrs. Cherri White presented on the STEM program. The STEM Pipeline Summer Camp took place at Davie County High School June 17, 2019-June 21, 2019 and June 24, 2019-June 28, 2019. A total of 31 students attended camp; 23 seventh graders and 8 eighth graders. The first week was focused on ecology while the second week focused on physics. Cherri White presented on updates with the STEM Center. STEM teachers and students were busy over the summer participating in enrichment trips, trainings, internships/externships, and STEM Freshman Kickoff. The STEM Center is in its 8th year and has become proficient in building relationships among teachers and students.

Mr. Anthony Davis presented on the CTE program updates. Over the summer of 2019, the CTE department was able to connect with local businesses, provide a summer camp opportunity for future and current Health Science students, and offer teachers some opportunities for professional development. The externships for STEM and CTE teachers as well as school counselors was another great success. This partnership with the Davie County Economic Development Council is integral in communicating the needs of local businesses to our future workforce. This year the CTE department partnered with COGNITION, DEX Heavy Duty Parts, Ashley Furniture, Flow Honda, Davie Medical Center, Ingersoll Rand, Dunlop Aircraft Tyres, Kontoor Brands, Pro Refrigeration, and the United Way.

Adjourn

Lori Smith made the motion to adjourn with a second from Wendy Horne; the motion was approved with a 6-0 vote. The meeting adjourned at 7:43pm.


