How do you apply for this assistance?

You can get up to 75% off certain Community Ed and other activities in Faribault through MAA. To get this discount, first apply to MAA at www.mnafterschool.org/apply to confirm your eligibility, and then MAA will send you instructions for how to register and pay your discounted rate. To be eligible, your household income must be \$33,500 or less in the current year and previous year.

How does MAA work?

MAA provides this discount by using the K-12 Education Tax Credit. When you register for an activity and pay your discounted price (the amount not covered by the Tax Credit), MAA pays the rest in the form of a no-interest advance. When you file your taxes, the government repays the advance directly to MAA using the Tax Credit dollars, so you don't have to repay the advance out of pocket.



Falcon's Nest Four Year Old Preschool is a nine-month program that gives students opportunities to meet and play with other children while learning important Kindergarten skills in a play-based classroom setting. Instruction is aligned with Minnesota Early Childhood Indicators of Progress for four-year olds. Beginning math and literacy skills are introduced using the Our World of Learning (OWL) curriculum. Children learn how to problem-solve and navigate emotions with guidance from adults trained in a proactive social-emotional curricular model.

Early Childhood Special Education Program (ECSE)

Faribault Public School's concern for children doesn't begin in kindergarten and end at graduation. Our teachers are on hand to work with children who need additional developmental and educational help from birth through



age 21. This program is designed to meet the developmental needs of our youngest learners. **Eligible children** are those with developmental delays or with a certain diagnosed physical or mental conditions or disorders that results in a delay.

Infant and Toddler

Early Intervention services for children birth to three years old are provided within the child's natural environments. These "Routines-Based Interventions" are based on the child's daily lives and are guided by your family's priorities. ECSE teachers will provide coaching to parents and caregivers to help promote a child's development. Families are coached in strategies to help improve developmental areas such as cognition and communication, as well as social, motor, and self-help skills.

Preschool Special Education

Our program strives to help young children interact successfully with friends and family at home, in the community, and at school. To achieve this goal, the ECSE staff work as partners with the parents and teachers.

Faribault Public Schools provides a continuum of special education and related services depending on each student's unique special education needs and the goals determined by the student's Individual Education Plan (IEP). Services are provided in the least restrictive environment which is appropriate for the individual student.

SCREEN AT 3

Minnesota law requires all children to be screened prior to school enrollment. Age **three** is the recommended age for this health and developmental screening.

3 Reasons to Screen at age 3:

- 1. Early screening can help set your child up for success in school.
- 2. Any health or learning concerns can be found earlier and help provided sooner.
- 3. Because screening is **FREE**, it's easy and it's good for your child! *Screening is preferred at three, but can be done at four or five

Early Childhood Family Education

What is ECFE?

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) recognizes that parents are their child's first teacher and provides resources and support for parents of children from birth to kindergarten. ECFE program offers a variety of classes for families to attend. Classes range from one-time events to weekly classes that vary in length depending on the age of the children attending.

Infant and Baby Options

ECFE classes for new parents are offered in collaboration with Rice County Public Health and Allina Health. Parents and caregivers can ask questions about development and share concerns, do weight and growth checks, have expert advice from lactation consultants and nurses while meeting other new parents.

Toddler, Preschool, and Mixed Age Classes

Each session offers a variety of classes to meet the needs of families and young learners. We are in the process of mapping out safe, healthy procedures to protect our staff and community members, while still offering quality programming for our youngest families. Classes are currently offered with smaller capacities have options for virtual partnerships. The Incident Command Center and early childhood site team are working continuously to adapt to necessary changes in plans. Class schedules and enrollment opportunities are available on Faribault Public School's website under McKinley and ECFE.





Classroom opportunities will be available at the FEC and include Parent-child Interaction Time as well as Children's Activity Time. Parent Education components will be offered in both virtual and inperson settings, while adhering to specific health and safety measures put in place. Parents and staff will be required to wear masks while participating in ECFE classes and events, but children five and under will not be required to wear a mask in programming, although encouraged. The FEC is located at 340 9th Ave SW- attached to the High School.

During parent education time, children explore, gain independence and practice social skills while under the supervision of a licensed teacher and a paraprofessional.

Kids World serves children from preschool (potty trained) through age twelve.





THE BASICS

- Students may enroll at 14 years of age, but they must be 15 to take the permit test.
- This course consists of the state-required 30 hours of classroom instruction and six hours of Behindthe-Wheel. The classroom prepares students for the written permit test. Upon completion of the classroom and obtaining a driver's permit, the Driver Education Coordinator schedules Behind-the-Wheel after students have passed the permit test. The Behind-the-Wheel component prepares students for the road test.
- A student is required to have their permit for six months and be 16 years of age before they are eligible to take the road test for their driver's license.

COST

- Driver Education costs are \$155 for 10 classroom days and \$240 for six hours of Behind-the-Wheel
- The cost for taking classroom elsewhere and taking six hours of Behind-the-Wheel sessions with Faribault Community Education is \$300
- Money will be forfeited for:
 - Discipline reasons, or failure to complete the requirements of the course
 - Missing two or more days of class
- If you fail to attend the class you are registered for:
 - A drop/add fee of \$50 will be assessed to register for another class
 - If money is refunded, \$50 will be subtracted from the registration fee
