




Like the Wise Men, let us trust that God will guide and strengthen us for our daily journey.

From the PAULpit



Winter time is usually a time that I get excited for, but this year is different. It's been a long time under the COVID restrictions and entering into winter with no more long, warm, sunny days is wearisome. It may be cold

but it feels more like a pressure cooker!

This experience has brought my attention to one of my favorite stories in the Bible from the book of Daniel. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego are three men of an unshakeable faith. They refuse to bow down and worship a golden idol set up by the king of Babylon, who was the most powerful man in the world at that time.

To refuse to worship the idol would result in being thrown into a furnace. But they tell the king to his face, "If our God, whom we serve, can save us from the white-hot furnace and from your hands, O king, may he save us! But even if he will not, you should know, O king, that we will not serve your god or worship the golden statue which you set up."

In other words, they say to the king, "I love my God and even if he will not save me from the fire, I will not turn my back on Him." The king becomes enraged and they are thrown into the furnace but an angel of the Lord enters the furnace with them and the flames do no harm.

This story is an example of incredible courage and faith. It may be a bit of a stretch but I do not think it is crazy to draw some similarities between the experiences of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego and all of us during this pandemic. We've been going through it for a while. It has been going on for 10 months and it feels like being in a white-hot furnace. We want to get out. We want it to end. We feel captured and tied up and unable to go about life as normal.

Though, as in all things, no matter what with no exceptions, Jesus Christ uses whatever our situations are to make us better sons and daughters of His Father. And the times when we grow the most are the most difficult times. God will allow for hardships but what He always does, every single time, is jump into them with us. He is not up in the sky as an onlooker. Not at all. He enters into the furnace with us so that we can walk out of them with greater faith and purer hearts. Sometimes our walk through the furnace we are in, does not seem to have an end in sight. We may feel defeated, exhausted, and we want to give up and throw the towel in – but that is the moment of victory. It is when we are at our weakest that we learn to use God's strength. The flames may not stop but they begin to lose their power over us.





History of the Divine Child Nativity

In 1986, Fr. Kucyk, who wanted to honor the life of Monsignor Weier (1904-1983), ordered new, large Nativity figures from Italy. In order to make the elaborate figurines correspond to a more substantial scene, Mike Foye '63, a long-time art teacher at the Divine Child High School, designed and built a new Nativity with the help of the 1986 stage crew. One of our Bernardine Sisters, S. Josephenia, a home economics and art teacher, painted the backdrop of Bethlehem.

Mr. Foye and his crew presented the Nativity to Fr. K on the Sunday before Christmas. Fr. Kucyk loved the new Crèche and it has been displayed on the St. Joseph side chapel ever since.

The reigns have since been turned over to Walter Grysko, an '07 DC graduate and current Divine Child High School art teacher, and some of his former classmates. The stage crew and friends from former students continue this long-standing tradition today by always displaying the Nativity on the Sunday before Christmas.

"This is our 17th year participating in this tradition for our alma mater and Parish," says Mr. Grysko. "It's important for us to remember where we came from and to make time to do things together which are truly important in life. It's something we really look forward to every year and plan on continuing for many years to come."


"And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel."

- 1. Begin... Come, Holy Spirit
- Read (lectio): Read the Mass Bible passage.
 Read it carefully, two or three times. Let it really
 soak in. Underline a word or sentence that stands
 out to you.
- 3. Meditation (meditatio). Ponder the words of the passage that stood out to you. Allow yourself to be moved by the Word of God to discover its meaning for your life.
- 4. Prayer (oratio). Speak to God about the passage. Be yourself. Allow time for silence to let God speak back to you. In this prayerful engagement with the Bible passage, you open yourself up to the possibility of contemplation.
- 5. Contemplation (contemplatio): Resting in silence ask, "God, show me the way."

EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING

This ceremony of the blessing of the home and the inscription of the initials of the three Magi above each door can be performed by the head of the family or another designated family member. Have some chalk on hand in preparation for the prayer.

Leader: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen

Leader: From the east came the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial. The star burned like a flame, pointing the way to God, the King of kings. The wise men saw the sign and brought their gifts in homage to their great king.

Lord, bless this chalk, and let it be a help to our family. Let us use it with faith in your most holy name, and with it inscribe on the doors of their homes the names of your saints, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar, may through their merits and intercession enjoy health in body and protection of soul; through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen

Leader: O Lord, Almighty God, bless our home that it may become a shelter of health, chastity, humility, goodness, mercy, obedience to the commandments, and thanksgiving to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May your blessing come upon this house, those who live here, and those who visit, through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen

After the prayer of the blessing are recited, inscribe the initials of the Magi upon the main entrance of your home as indicated below:

20 + C + M + B + 21

The initials, C,M,B, can also be interpreted as the Latin phrase - Christus mansionem benedicat - which means "Christ bless this house." The plus signs represent the cross, and the numbers in the beginning and end mark the year.

Leader: Let us prayer together the prayer that Jesus taught us. Our Father.....

All: Amen.

KNIGHT OF COLUMBUS COATS FOR KIDS PROGRAM

Coats for Kids is a national program sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. The distribution of coats is organized by State and local councils. The Foley Knights purchased 72 coats through private donations and fund raising. Six Foley Knights and family members joined neighboring Detroit Diocesan councils to distribute coats to children on Saturday, December 12th at the Basilica of Sainte Anne de Détroit. Over 800 coats were available at St. Anne's and every single one went home with a thankful child. The State of Michigan sponsored additional distribution sites including the diocese of Grand Rapids, Muskegon, Pontiac, Flint, Lansing, and Saginaw. Well over 6,700 coats were distributed in Michigan by the State and local councils this year.

Family Fun! Paper Crowns

Make paper crowns for the whole family and wear them at dinner to celebrate the feast of the Epiphany!

Materials:

- -Thin cardboard (poster board or old cereal boxes work well)
- -Foil gift wrap or construction paper
- -Scissors, glue, stapler, paint, crayons or felt tip pens
- -Optional: stickers, markers, glitter, shapes cut from construction paper

Instructions: Cut a strip of cardboard 3 or 4 inches wide and long enough to go around each person's head and overlap slightly. Cut a piece of construction paper or foil gift wrap the same length but slightly wider (2 inches wider). Glue the construction paper to the cardboard so the bottom edge lines up. Cut a zigzag in the top edge of the construction paper. Note: The construction paper is wider to make it easier to cut the zigzag; it is difficult to cut the zigzag from the cardboard. Decorate using markers, glitter or stickers. Make a ring with the cardboard facing in (toward the head) and the paper facing out and staple to make a crown.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK:

Apple Crisp

Epiphany is celebrated in different ways all over the world. In England, there is a custom of blessing apple trees. Enjoy this apple dessert on this holy day.

8 large apples, peeled and sliced

1 tsp. cinnamon

1 cup brown sugar

1 cup granulated sugar

1 cup flour

1 egg

1/2 tsp. salt

1 tsp. baking powder

1/2 cup melted butter (optional)

Preheat oven to 350 F. Place sliced apples in greased 9x13 baking dish. Combine cinnamon and brown sugar. Sprinkle 1/2 of mixture over apples. Combine granulated sugar, flour, egg, salt, and baking powder. Spread this mixture over apples, which will act as a crust. Sprinkle remaining cinnamon/brown sugar mixture over top. Optional: pour butter over everything. Bake for 40 minutes or until golden brown and bubbly.

Meet Our Extended Family:

St. Philomena (Feast Day August 11) Jan. 10, 291 - Aug. 10, 304

It is said that St. Philomena revealed her story to three people who did not know one another and who resided in different parts of the world. These private revelations unveiled the story of St. Philomena's life in great detail and were amazingly identical accounts. One of the revelations came to Sister Maria Luisa di Gesu. St. Philomena came to her and told her she was the daughter of a Greek king who converted to Christianity. When Philomena was 13 years old, she took a vow of consecrated virginity. After her father took his family to Rome to make peace, Emperor Diocletian fell in love with Philomena. When she refused to marry him, she was repeatedly subjected to torture. Yet, in the midst of this torture, God continued to miraculously comfort her and heal her. This infuriated the Emperor who finally had her beheaded. St. Philomena said to Sister Maria Luisa di Gesu, "My soul took flight towards my heavenly Spouse, who placed me, with he crown of virginity and the palm of martyrdom, in a distinguished place among the elect. That day was so happy for me..."

The young virgin willingly traded her earthly life for heavenly salvation and continues her work today promoting the virtues of purity and sanctity among the world's youth and bringing the faithful closer to our Blessed Mother and Jesus Christ. Her name means "daughter of light" (Latin: fila luminis), and she is credited with countless miracles and intercessions since discover of her tomb in the most ancient catacombs of St. Priscilla in Rome in 1802.


