Science at GMS

Science is a natural process of observing phenomena, wondering how the world works, and searching for answers. Every student at GMS is a scientist who learns and practices the skills that professional scientists use in their daily endeavors. Because science is a way of understanding the world around us, rather than a collection of vocabulary and facts, students engage in hands-on explorations, inquiries, and projects as they explore the natural world.

The GMS science curriculum explores the concepts that have shaped earth, life and physical sciences. We focus on building science skills across the students' three years as they move through different disciplines. Our goal is for girls to have authentic science experiences that teach them to discover connections, and inspire them to study science in high school and beyond.
