

These continue to be very difficult times for everyone, and we are blessed that we have been able to continue to hold our celebration of Masses daily.

As time goes by, we have a tendency to become more relaxed with the situation, however the threat of the virus is still very real. I ask that you please diligently follow the rules and regulations established for the safety of all. We must stay vigilant to ensure that we are all protected as much as possible.

## Ideas for Giving and Moving Forward in 2020

The Archdiocese of Miami and Blessed Trinity Catholic Church and School continue to move forward with its ministerial work. Today, we find ourselves in a time of twin crises: a global public health crisis and an economic crisis. Yet, around the world, we are united in common purpose of caring for the sick, pursuing a cure, and lifting the human spirit. As a people of charity, despite our own fears and anxieties, we must stand in solidarity with all our brothers and sisters who are infected or affected. In response to the current situation, Congress recently enacted several tax law changes. We have created this page to offer resources to help you with your tax planning and to offer some ideas for you to consider if you are thinking about making a gift in support of our mission during this time.

### **SECURE Act**

In December, Congress passed SECURE Act, limiting stretch payments to IRA beneficiaries to 10 years. If you planned to benefit your children with your IRA, your heirs will now pay higher taxes on the inheritance they receive from you. When you revisit your estate plan, consider funding a testamentary charitable remainder unitrust with your IRA balance. This plan can provide lifetime payments to your heirs and spread out the taxes on their inheritance.

### **CARES** Act

A new deduction for charitable donors who do not itemize when filing their tax returns. If you do not itemize but make a gift to charity, you will be allowed to take a special tax deduction, up to \$300, to reduce your tax liability.

An increase in the deduction limit up to 100% of a donor's annual income for cash gifts (previously the deduction was capped at 60% of annual income). If you make a gift you will be able to deduct more this year.



Dear Parents and Guardians,

I pray this email finds you well and safe together with your beautiful families. I hope that you are enjoying summer vacation to the fullest extent possible at this time.

As you know, COVID-19 has presented us with many interesting challenges for the 2020-2021 school year. Following CDC guidelines and recommendations, as well as the Archdiocesan Instructional Continuity Plan, we are looking at the best possible ways to reopen our campus. The safety of your children and families, as well as that of our faculty and staff is our priority.

A blueprint for the most effective model that will maximize the learning benefits for our students has been developed. Under our current plan, we are working **under the assumption** that at least for some part of the day, if not all, we will have students present at the school. We have also taken into consideration the fluid nature of this situation and the possibility of full virtual instruction. Thank you for completing the parent surveys at the end of the school year. We have reviewed your responses and have taken action in order to provide a more complete virtual learning experience for our students, should this be the primary method of instruction.

We will have the following procedures in place as we believe they will limit our vulnerability to unnecessary risk even though we recognize there are no guarantees, we have:

- \* Engaged the services of a professional cleaning company (<a href="http://www.gocitywide.com/miami">http://www.gocitywide.com/miami</a>). In addition to the daily cleaning after our students are gone, we will have a Custodial Day Porter to maintain the restrooms and classrooms during the day. This will include but is not limited to, daily electrostatic disinfection.
- \* Ordered individual student and teacher safety shields for our desks and tables to help minimize the spread. Students a staff will be required to wear masks/shields for their protection and that of others. We are developing ways to create smaller groups in order to provide for maximum distancing as well.
- \* Purchased GreenTech Air purifiers for each room on the school and church campus pureAir on Vimeo.
- \* Our students' movement from room to room will be limited in order to help minimize any spread of the virus.
- \* Lunch will be eaten in the classrooms.

As stated before, we want to keep the risk of contamination to a bare minimum. Therefore, we will maintain a closed campus. Parents and visitors will not have access to the school buildings. They will be admitted to the school office, only with an appointment. All other communications will be made via email, telephone, or Zoom meeting. This, unfortunately, will preclude the students from receiving any type of therapy, speech, occupational or otherwise during school hours or on school grounds.

We are committed to keeping our students' excitement and passion for learning alive. Creating experiences both academically and spiritually that have always and will continue to define our BT community. We will serve to be the leaders of faith and knowledge to those precious minds and tender souls that each family has entrusted us with. Each experience will be filled with the joy of learning, the inquiry of the unknown and the faith that together with Christ we can achieve all things.

With God's help and the protection of our Blessed Mother, we will have a healthy school year where our students will flourish academically, grow spiritually, and develop socially. I am confident that He hears our prayers and will answer them.
