Registration Form

The 2021-2022 Registration form is attached. We have made a couple of small changes to the registration process for this year. We will no longer be sending out a Tuition Indicator Form in February. The attached Registration Form will be the only form that you need to return. Another change that we have made is that we have added a Pay in Full option in the FACTS portal. This will allow families that would like to use a credit card to pay in full, to do so. To do this, you will need to create a FACTS account, <u>https://online.factsmgt.com/signin/3FQSS</u>.You will still have the option to mail in a check, if you prefer to do so. Invoices will be sent in June and Pay in Full payments are now due July 1st. We are happy to say that there will be no increase in tuition for the 2021-2022 school year. We understand that these are trying times for all, and we are trying to do everything in our power to not add to the stress that all families are already feeling. Please complete the Registration Form and return it to the Office with your registration fee of \$250 by January 29, 2021. Indicate if you have a child coming NEW to Mercymount next year so that we can ascertain our numbers for 2021-2022. All new incoming students must submit a completed application form, birth certificate and baptism certificate, if applicable.
