

What is your home school?






Please give the option to work from home or in the building during closures. Everyone has a different situation at home that may or may not be conducive to teaching. For those that can successfully, they should be allowed.

Which School does your child attend?







- Shifted to fully remote instruction following the holiday break in light of anticipated surge in cases. Need to evaluate status of current cases as we look toward next week.
- Teachers allowed the choice to teach from home
- Wednesdays continue to be needed for planning and professional responsibilities as the work load has tripled in the hybrid environment in particular. Even fully virtual instruction requires complete retooling of instruction
- Science and Social Studies are being taught at the elementary level.
 Scope and sequence redesigned to adapt to the limitations of the current environment but still very much valued and necessary
- Looking for ways to recapture time in current model and planning for ways to reintroduce more-all elementary students back into school if/when it is safe.
