Our position remains that, whether public examinations take place or not this summer, we will need to complete the delivery of the full syllabus in each subject and pupils will need to remain fully engaged in their learning as we prepare them for the next stage of their education here at Royal Russell or beyond.

I would like to congratulate those Year 11, 12 and 13 pupils who have successfully completed the GCSE and BTEC examinations which we ran on Wednesday and Thursday of this week. It was very reassuring to see some 'normal' activity on site, safely completed, for these groups.

In a week where we have seen news and announcements which have affected all of us very deeply, I shared an image with staff from Charlie Mackesy, which I felt was particularly powerful. I hope you are all able to take the next step forward as we move towards a return to learning together here on site in the future and I wish you all a very successful term ahead.
