GREETINGS FROM THE HEAD MASTER

Greetings to all Alumni, wherever they may be. In these days we know they are in all kinds of Service—headed for all parts of the world. Naturally, they carry with them all our interest and best wishes for their success. We have written records and letters for more than three hundred of our 890 listed alumni. There will be many more. In the service of their country, there is no doubt they will acquit themselves in ways both honorable and memorable.

The School will find rough going in this critical time. Last year we lost three teachers to selective service training. At that time it was supposed we would get them back after a year. Entering the war changed that. This year two more have gone, and a third will go soon. So we have already lost Formwalt, Ballantine, Young, Privette, and Whiteley (Lower School). Soon Ramsay Jones, Head of the Lower School will go. The new registration covers men up to 44 years. Just how that will affect us remains to be seen.

New taxes, and promise of more, will affect enrollment. So will the departure of some young parents into service and young doctors into medical units. It would appear that we must seek funds to help carry the boys of these parents through and it is hoped we can find further scholarship funds to do so.

Our enrollment this year is 283, against 289 last year. In the Upper School there are 183 boys against 185 last year; in the Lower 100 against 104. We have, however, 25 boarders, regular and temporary, against 21 last year. It is in this latter department that Alumni could help the School most.

In School work, Mathematics and Sciences are being stressed somewhat more. A course in Air Navigation is given to a number of Fifth and Sixth Formers. Rifle practice is offered older boys. We expect to add other items such as Military Map work and radio communication. The main core of school work is being maintained, since it is strongly advised by all arms of the Service.

Adequate precautions, under Civilian Defense, have been taken for the safety of the student body. First Aid classes for the faculty are about complete. There will be others for students. There are two first aid stations in the School. A fire unit will also be established here.

Athletics will be run about as usual, perhaps with fewer long trips, and greater stress on close attention to physical fitness.

All alumni received an account of the beginning of our Work Plan last fall. It is gratifying to report that it is working well and that boys have accepted it in a very co-operative spirit. By next fall, it will doubtless be further expanded. There has probably been no change ever made by the School which has received greater or more enthusiastic support of parents.

In the accompanying booklet, you will get much more extensive news of Alumni, and we hope you will all welcome this new venture with enthusiasm.

FOREWORD

This, the first issue of the ALUMNI BULLETIN is published to meet the growing need for a means by which news of the Alumni, and of the School, might be circulated among the Alumni from time to time.

From over 300 replies to the recent return postcard questionnaire sent to all Alumni, Mr. Hausmann, School Historian and Editor of the ALUMNI BULLETIN, has compiled the notes appearing in the Alumni News section of this issue of the BULLETIN. In making the compilation he has had the assistance of the Class Secretaries, who have been appointed this year to report news of the members of their respective classes, and to serve as class representatives in connection with various Alumni Association activities.

During the past year the activities of the Association have included Alumni Day held at the School last May and the Alumni Luncheon held downtown in November preceding the McDonogh football game. The next important event on the Alumni calendar will be the Annual Dinner of the Association to be held at the Elkridge Club, Monday, April 6th, at 7 P. M. General Milton A. Reckord, Commander of the Third Corps Area, will be our guest of honor and speaker. As the School's 1941 Christmas Dinner was called off, the Annual Dinner of the Association will be the first evening gathering of Alumni for approximately a year; and it is hoped that in spite of the many conflicting current demands on the time of Alumni, the Dinner will be well attended.

As shown in the Treasurer's report printed below, the Association has continued to maintain its annual scholarship fund of \$400. Three sons of Alumni are receiving aid from the fund during the current School year. The Association also contributed \$25 toward gold footballs presented to members of the School's 1941 championship football team.

Alumni are playing an increasingly important part in the life of the School. Eleven Alumni are on the Board of Trustees, not counting the four officers of the Alumni Association serving as ex-officio members of the Board. Fifty-five sons of Alumni attend the School.

A close relationship between the Alumni and the School is of great value to the School, particularly in times such as the present. It is hoped that the ALUMNI BULLETIN will in some measure further this end, and strengthen the ties that bind the Alumni Association, and its members, to the School.
