EHS Graduation Requirements

Complete a total of 66 credits:

- **English** 4 years (12 credits)
- **Social Studies** 4 years (12 credits)
- **Science** 3 years (9 credits) (1 year Biology & 1 year Chemistry or Physics)
- **Math** 3 years (9 credits) (1 year Algebra II)
- **Health** 2 credits (Issues I and Issues II)
- **Phy Ed** 4 credits
- **Safety Ed** 1 credit
- **Arts** 1 credit in Visual Arts or Performing Arts. Some other choices include: Interior Design, Intro to Graphics & Video, Architecture & Landscaping, Marketing B, Creative Writing
- **Electives** 16 credits (not more than 12 in Music or Work Experience)

Notes:

- World Languages are not required for graduation from EHS. However, some colleges have a minimum admissions requirement of two years of a single language.
