

# Incoming Freshman Placement Guidelines

## Lake Zurich High School

*Lake Zurich High School meets the individual needs of students by providing ability grouping in the academic areas of English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, and World Languages. Parents are encouraged to discuss placement guidelines and placement recommendations with their child and respective middle school teachers. Questions about the high school curriculum can be directed to the high school division heads. There is a waiver process in February for changing the placement recommended by the middle school teacher.*

### LITERACY DIVISION

**Division Head: Lauren Katzman**

*The English Department provides broad coverage of the texts of American and world literature. Through these sequential course offerings, students develop extensive knowledge of literature, progressively develop academic and creative writing skills, and enhance their knowledge and use of grammar, vocabulary, and communication skills. **Some 9<sup>th</sup> graders, who are placed in College Prep English I, will also be required to take Reading Strategies I based on their test scores for the entire year, for one credit, pass/fail.** Outside of AP World History, English placements most often mirror a student's social studies placement.*

*The Social Studies Department and its curriculum are designed to help each student become an intelligent and responsible citizen. The teachers in the department will provide classroom experiences which will help the students learn about the past, democratic ideals, other cultures, and an appreciation of human dignity, justice, and compassion for all people. Teacher recommendation for placement in AP World History is highly recommended, as the course is designed to provide students college-level coursework and expectations. Outside of AP World History, English placements most often mirror a student's social studies placement.*

*The Mathematics Department offers courses in pure and applied mathematics to assist the students in the pursuit of intellectual, academic, and career goals. The aim of the department is to provide the student with a sound mathematical foundation.*

\*Students may enroll and successfully complete the LZHS summer school course Bridge to Advanced Math (one semester) to then be placed in Honors Geometry freshman year, pending availability. To successfully complete this course, students must demonstrate mastery on benchmark assessments.

### SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING DIVISION

*The Science Department provides programs for earth/space science, biology, chemistry and physics. Programs consist of lecture, discussions, projects, and laboratory experiments. The department also provides a number of opportunities outside the classroom for learning that takes the form of projects, experiments, field trips and various science competitions offered throughout the year.*

*The World Language Department is designed to provide students with a broad background in French, German, and Spanish. There are four skills developed in a language: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. These skills are stressed throughout the program as are the languages' individual development, culture, and history.*

Course Offering	8 <sup>th</sup> Grade Performance
<b>College Prep Level I French, German, or Spanish</b>	This course is designed for students who are new to a foreign language with no previous experience. It <i>may</i> be taken by students who took level I in middle school, who need to review the material to gain a stronger base.
<b>College Prep Level II French, German, or Spanish</b>	“B” or higher in 8 <sup>th</sup> grade Level I of the language Recommendation by the 8 <sup>th</sup> grade French, German or Spanish teacher
<b>Honors Level II French, German, or Spanish</b>	“A” in 8 <sup>th</sup> grade Level I of the language Recommendation by the 8 <sup>th</sup> grade French, German or Spanish teacher

## FINE ARTS AND BUSINESS DIVISION

*The Fine Arts Department offers courses in music, art, and theater. Placement for Jazz Lab Band and percussions in all bands will be through an audition process.*
