




AN INCLUSIVE SCHOOL COMMUNITY

DEVELOPING POSITIVE BEHAVIORS

Dolores Huerta utilizes Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), a schoolwide focus on developing and rewarding students for positive behaviors. By focusing on prevention rather than punishment, we are able to keep students engaged and in school. Our goal is to educate the whole child by meeting his or her social, emotional, and academic needs.

With strong social and emotional skills, our students will be able to set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions.

FOCUS ON COMMUNITY

Our school places significant value on parent involvement because we know that a parent is a child's first teacher! In addition to hosting book fairs and holiday festivals, we are excited to partner with the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma to create a pop-up market. Families attend these monthly events in our school to purchase fresh dairy products, proteins and vegetables.
