OUR HERITAGE

Named for one of Tulsa's – and the nation's – best jazz artists, Wayman Tisdale Fine Arts Academy aspires to match the inspirational life of Wayman Tisdale. A graduate of Tulsa Public Schools and a three-time All American basketball player at the University of Oklahoma, Tisdale went on to become a noted smooth jazz bass guitarist. Tragically, his inspiring life was cut short by illness in 2009 when he died at the age of 44. Today, his family remains active with the school named in his honor to continue his legacy, preserve his memory, and lift the hopes of all students who learn there.

STEM PROGRAMMING
