DIRECTORS NOTES

Who could have imagined! A GDS show without the Box, without scene or costume shops, without a light hang, without the rituals---"5, 6, 7, 8" or "We Won!"---without late night techs and dinners provided by parents, without the incubator-like conditions in the dressing rooms, without Dylan at the Producers' desk.

There's a great Italian expression in my family: "Cosa ci faccio io su questa strada?" How is it that I find myself in this street? I imagined interviews with COVID victims; student written pieces on BLM; anything that didn't need a set, heavy-duty costumes and makeup. "Words, words, words" was the answer, and provocative ideas. Who better at that than William S. Do I dare imagine Hamlet, the longest play in the canon? Well, I'm good at cutting and pasting, and I do it literally.

I'd taught the play perhaps 25 times. I can recite most of the soliloquies. I began not knowing what would be the medium. Would we run around outside in masks and socially distanced? Our first design meetings included masks as part of the costumes. Then, how do we create sets? Perhaps a brick wall and a layer of tin by the HS dumpster. The more we talked, the more I learned about Zoom. I could conduct a meeting on Zoom, but I didn't know anything about virtual settings or how we could all see the same screen. Thank you, dear Young People, you discovered and taught me. Quickly it became clear that this was a Zoom production like no other. The designers flew, mailing costumes, props, even lights to each actor. Sets people drove somewhere north of Baltimore to find the perfect graveyard, coincidentally an abandoned school named Tome. Anike arrived and work shopped the makeup, including shopping lists for the local drugstore. The actors set up mini-studios in their closets and we

were off.

And why is Hamlet the perfect piece, as is often the case, for a particular time in history? It's about kids; kids victimized by the corruption of adults, unable to protest, enraged. Of course, the differences were not lost on the company as they marched in the spring and brought out the vote in the fall. Ophelia, Laertes, even Rosencrantz and Guildenstern, do what they're told. Hamlet resists, rationalizes, stalls, procrastinates---after all the ghost said get revenge, but "taint not your mind." Can he murder the king and yet go to heaven? The only way was to look to the stars---slowly, but surely, he pins his faith on birds, on plants, on the human body, on the Cosmos. He dies in the arms of his only true ally, Horatio, who asks the angels to "sing thee to thy rest", to give Hamlet what he wanted from day one: peace.

This production is imperfect and that's good. In 2020 we needed to let go of perfection, to understand that process is more important and more sustaining than product. This process was often tedious, even painstaking, but my greatest pleasure was the leadership role the techs took; and the respect and patience the actors gave them as they followed the tech's instructions. This process was more collaborative, more creative and more full of love than any live production I've ever done.
