#### b) TSSA budget adjustment

• \$23,000 set aside for projectors, Apple TV, and sound systems. Most of the hardware has showed up we are waiting for the installers to come do the work.

• \$16,000 allocated for stipends for CANVAS, MTSS, and SEL team. Half of those funds were distributed in December the remaining funds will be distributed in April or May.

• 30 iPads and 32 Cloudbooks have been received and are being distributed.

• \$200 of money allocated for recess equipment has been spent.

Personal Competency Based Learning. District is looking for feedback from community councils in how to implement this in Davis County Schools. Devin specifically wanted our input on what skills, dispositions, and experiences students

should have to become good innovators, and also wanted our input on how we could determine that those skills, dispositions and experiences could be mastered.

#### 5. Trust Lands Items, Budget, or Updates

- a) Update on Budget
- Land Trust Budget
  - \$117,415.56 to start the year with \$11,807.56 carryover

• We still have an Americorp payment of \$4,700 and a \$1,500 extended day payment to be dispersed.

- It looks like we have about \$5,000 in surplus depending on salaries
- TSSA funds
  - \$112,819 to start the year with \$5,791 carryover
  - We still have \$8,000 in stipends, \$4,000 sub days to be dispersed
  - It looks like we have about \$7,000 in surplus depending on salaries
    - b) Review Goals
      - a. Last year's goals
        - i. Cook elementary will increase the number of students proficient on DIBELS composite by 12% from BOY to EOY.
        - ii. 80% of students across grades1-4 will achieve automaticity in their math facts as measured by Reflex Math at the EOY. 80% of students 5-6 will achieve proficiency on Imagine Math benchmarks.
      - b. This year's goals
        - i. Math Goal: Cook elementary will increase student mean growth in math as measured by performance on the CRT/RISE assessments by 5% from a MGP of 39 2018-19 school year to a MGP of 44 in the 2020-21 school year. (We will be looking at how to adjust this goal.)
        - ii. ELA Goal: Cook Elementary will increase the number of students proficient on Acadience testing composite score by 10% by BOY to MOY during the 2020-21 school year.
        - iii. SEL Goal: Build foundational knowledge and capacity for faculty and staff in the five CASEL competencies of self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making adults by creating a school SEL plan using the Davis School District's SEL Walkthrough Tool.
