Dear Families,

Welcome to 2021! It has been an interesting school year so far and as I write this, we are preparing to welcome students back to full time in person learning in a couple of weeks. This is exciting and yet thought provoking. We are continuing to ensure a safe environment for our staff and students by encouraging healthy habits of washing/sanitizing hands, wearing face coverings, selfmonitoring and keeping distance. As we all come back together, we will get to know each other again and reestablish the routines and procedures that make the best environment for learning. Students have experienced different levels of support and independence during these last couple of months and will need some time and support to blend all those experiences with the guidance of our staff. We may have to work on the stamina and sustainability to learning for longer periods of the day! And, maybe we have learned that taking frequent breaks does us all good so you may see lines of students taking a walk around the school during the day. We know that the technology will still be important and offer us a way to differentiate the learning for students, so we will use that investment wisely.


