**College & Career of the Week:** One of the most unique programs available to Connecticut students is the "Regional Student Program (RSP)", sponsored by the New England Board of Higher Education. "Tuition Break" or RSP "provides significant tuition savings to residents of the six New England states when they enroll at out-of-state public colleges and universities within New England and pursue approved programs" (nebhe.org). Students pay less for tuition within hundreds of approved programs. Learn more about eligibility and applying to these programs by visiting the website. "Environmental scientists and specialists use their knowledge of the natural sciences to protect the environment and human health", (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2019). Environmental scientists usually do most of their work in a laboratory - however, many go out into the field to gather various types of samples for testing. A bachelor's degree is required for most entry-level environmental scientist positions and a master's degree is likely needed for advancement. The average annual salary is \$71,360 with much faster than average job growth expected (8%) through 2029 (BLS, 2019). **Working Papers:** Due to restrictions governed by the Connecticut Department of Labor, some jobs may require WORKING PAPERS. In order to obtain WORKING PAPERS, a student must present a promise of employment letter from the hiring employer as well as a copy of **one** of the following: student's birth certificate, passport, driver's license or a learners permit. WORKING PAPERS are needed for formal employment by students under the age of 17. You may obtain working papers in the College & Career Center.

**ASVAB test** will be given at Amity High School on **Wednesday**, **April 21**, **2021 at 8:00am**. Any student in grades 10, 11 or 12 is welcome to take the test. The ASVAB or "Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery" is an online, multiple-choice test that helps students identify career strengths. **Students may register to take the test by signing up <a href="here">here</a>.
