

# COVID-19 DASHBOARD | Spring Lake Park Schools

## January 15, 2021

This dashboard is updated weekly on Fridays and represents a snapshot of the current situation and data.

Spring Lake Park Schools works with our regional support team – including public health experts from Anoka County and Minnesota Department of Health – to understand county, district and school data and trends. As we reach thresholds defined in [Minnesota’s Safe Learning Plan](#), we pause like at a stop sign, to understand the community situation and determine if a learning model change is advised.

### Situation this week

Spring Lake Park Schools students in preschool through sixth grade will return to learning full-time at school beginning January 21, 2021 follow revised guidance to Minnesota’s Safe Learning Plan. There will be no school for preK-6 students on January 19-20 as teachers prepare for the transition. Students in grades 7-12 continue in Extended Flexible Learning (distance learning). The state continues to direct that county case numbers must dip below the threshold of 30 cases per 10,000 residents to return grades 7-12 to school. We hope to be making a transition in February.

### Anoka County Case Rates – 14-Day Reporting Period


The 14-day Anoka County COVID-19 case rate is a determining factor in our current learning model as outlined in Minnesota’s Safe Learning Plan. County-level data and trends guide decision-making unless there is a compelling reason within our local context not to. This data lags by two weeks.



Minnesota’s Safe Learning Plan	
Cases per 10,000	Guidance
0 to less than 10	In-person learning for all students
10 to less than 20	Elementary in-person, middle/high school hybrid
20 to less than 30	Both hybrid
30 to less than 50	Elementary hybrid, middle/high school distance
50 or more	Both distance

### Anoka County Case Rates – Last 14 days

The [Minnesota Department of Health](#) reports case numbers each day at 11 a.m. for the previous day. These numbers preview what we can expect in the weekly 14-day county case rate report.



Spring Lake Park Schools district-specific data will be reported again when students and staff have transitioned from an Extended Flexible Learning (distance learning) model to one in which learning is happening within school buildings.
