To graduate from SHS, you only need 2 ½ credits of social studies (World Cultures, US History, Government). Some examples of these extra electives include world history, psychology, sociology, and economics.
- Many 4-year universities also require 3 years of a science. Please contact potential schools to understand what coursework is needed for entrance as these vary for each school.
