BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Wyland began by thanking his fellow board members and Dr. Steinhauer for their work in preparing for the important decisions that will be discussed at the meeting. He knows that the community is very concerned and anxious about the path forward. The Board is concerned also. They take the responsibility of effectively education the students in a way that is safe very seriously.

The discussion for the meeting included the following:

- A discussion of a plan to remain in remote instruction while planning a staggered return to hybrid instruction beginning with elementary education following the winter break on January 4, 2021.
- A COVID update from the Dr. Steinhauer that included a review of the Health and Safety Plan and Reopening Education Plan.
- Review of the updated guidance from Governor Wolf, and the PA Departments of Health & Education

• The discussion of athletics in light of the Governor's recent order to pause athletics across the state.

The Board will discuss and debate the guidance recommendations presented and develop resolutions for action by the Board. Mr. Wyland then asked the Board for a motion to continue the meeting to Wednesday, December 16, 2020, at 7:30 p.m. to take action on those resolutions.

Mr. Wyland congratulated Business Director Rob Geletko and his staff for being recognized by the Association of School Business Officials International with the Meritorious Budget Award for the 2020-2021 budget year. The award acknowledges the Mt. Lebanon School District for excellence in budget presentation. This is the 26th year in a row that the District has been recognized with this award.

In closing, the board president stated that the best gift we can give is to take care of each other during this difficult time. Please remember to mask up at all times, keep a safe distance from others, wash your hands regularly and follow the advice of public experts regarding travel and gatherings. It's up to all of us to keep our community safe.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Steinhauer reported that the Middle States Association Commission on Elementary and Secondary Schools recently recognized Mt. Lebanon High School's Visual Arts as a "Program of Distinction." The Middle States Programs of Distinction initiative provides external validation of an accredited school's accomplishments in specific areas of expertise. The superintendent congratulated Fine Arts Department Chair and high school art teacher, Jennifer Rodriquez, and high school art teacher Greg Kuhar for their creative and visionary teaching. They have inspired our students to reach beyond the ordinary, and if you have every attended the spring Student Art Show, the displayed student work exemplifies artistic excellence. The arts have always been an integral part of a Mt. Lebanon Education and a vital contribution to a vibrant society. Dr. Steinhauer congratulated Jennifer and Greg for this outstanding recognition.

High School English Teacher Patricia Shine was named the 2020 Recipient of the Henry G. Cram Accreditation Leadership Award. According to the Middle States Association website: "The award honors unsung heroes of the accreditation process who devote countless hours and energy to obtain and maintain accreditation of their schools. Recipients are chosen because they have a strong belief in, and deep understanding, of the Middle States accreditation process and a track record of creating and maintaining a school culture focused on continuous school improvement." Trish has been a leader in our high school's accreditation process and our 2nd programs of distinction award. She has expertly shepherded the process by her keen attention to detail and thoroughness reflected in each of the applications we submit. Dr. Steinhauer congratulated Patricia for this outstanding achievement.

Each December, over 20 leading high schools from across Pennsylvania compete at the Model European Union sponsored by the University of Pittsburgh. For the 7th consecutive year, Mt. Lebanon students won the 1st place Team Award at the Model EU tournament and captured the most number of individual student honors. Winning 1st place honors were Jack Horrigan and Sam Bailey representing Germany; Jack Silverman and Nora Kulze representing The Netherlands; and Raafay Khan and Ben Ash representing Finland. Taking 2nd place were seniors Ben Brown and Peter Swindal representing the nation of Ireland. This year's tournament was conducted online, and featured the topics of "Europe's Response to Covid-19" and "The Impact of Migration on the EU." It was the first online version of Model UN held in Western Pennsylvania. Congratulations to our students and their coaches, George Savarese and Adam Lumish.
